## Kildare County Council Announces the Publication of the Draft Kildare Town Local Area Plan


Kildare County Council has announced the publication of the Draft Kildare Town Local Area Plan 2023-2029 for public Consultation.

Local Enterprise Office, Kildare have announced that Caoimhe Lynch, Grace Donoghue, Lalita Geoghegan, Laura McLoughlin and Sienna Field from Slates & Co. at St. Wolstan's Community School, Celbridge will represent Kildare in the Senior Category at this year's Student Enterprise Programme National Finals on Friday 5th May, Croke Park.

n the "My Entrepreneurial Journey" category open to junior and intermediate students, Heidi Beary of Le Petit Hibou at Newbridge College will represent Kildare in the National Finals.

The students all took part in the Kildare Final

on Thursday 23rd March 2023, which was held at the Killashee Hotel, Naas. An estimated 1280 students from participating secondary schools across Kildare took part in the annual programme locally.

The enterprise education initiative, funded by the



Government of Ireland through Enterprise Ireland and delivered by the 31 Local Enterprise Offices in local authorities throughout the country, saw over 25,000 students from just under 500 secondary schools across the country take part in 2021 / 2022.

# Newly open Celbridge Link Road to help relieve local traffic congestion

## Minister O'Gorman publishes Spotlight report on Young People's Participation in Youth Organisations

Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, Roderic O'Gorman, has today (28 February 2023) published a report, which collates available data on young people's participation in youth organisations.

peaking about this report, Minister O'Gorman said "We know that participation in youth services is one of the key ways to enable young people to overcome adverse circumstances, and achieve their full potential, by strengthening their personal and social competencies. Today's report provides us with key data on young people's participation in youth organisations based on factors such as financial situation, housing tenure and disability, that will inform the ongoing implementation of youth-related policies and strategies. It also helps us track how we compare with our European Union neighbours and I am happy to note that young

people's participation in youth organisations in Ireland over the last decade has remained relatively high compared to European averages."

This report on Young People's Participation in Youth Organisations is the ninth report in a series of Statistical Spotlights. These Spotlight publications are topical in nature and of interest to both specialist and general readers. The data is sourced from European surveys and from Growing Up in Ireland, the national longitudinal study on children and young people.

Some of the key findings from the report are:

Young people's participation in youth organisations in Ireland



over the last decade has remained relatively high compared to European averages.

In 2021, 23% of 16-30-year-olds in Ireland reported having ever joined a youth organisation, compared to 14% in the EU27 as a whole.

In Ireland and the EU27, males and females had similar rates of participation in youth organisations, with participation slightly higher for males than females in 2021, the most recent survey year.

In both Ireland and the EU27, younger people (15-19-year-olds) had higher percentages of participation in youth organisations than those who were older (20-30-year-olds).

In both Ireland and the EU27, young people who were still studying had higher percentages of participation in youth organisations than those whose education had ceased.

In the EU27, a higher percentage of self-employed respondents reported that they had ever joined a youth organisation compared to other groups of respondents – employee, manual worker, or not working.

The percentage of 15-30-year-olds in Ireland who participated in a youth organisation was highest for respondents living in small/ mid-size towns when compared to those living in rural villages or

large towns.

In Ireland, where the household financial situation was categorised as "not enough money for basic bills", a higher percentage of respondents reported that they had ever joined a youth organisation compared to those in other household financial situations.

In the EU27, the percentage of 16-30-year-olds who had ever joined a youth organisation was significantly higher among respondents who speak more than one European language than among those who speak only one or none.

From young people in the "Growing Up in Ireland" study:

More 13-year-old females (36%) participated in youth clubs compared to males (32%). 17/18-year-old and 20-year-old males and females reported similar levels of participation in youth clubs.

Children from households with lower annual incomes reported more participation in youth clubs than children from households with higher annual incomes.

Young people's participation in youth clubs was greater for those living in rented housing than those living in owned housing.

More 17-year-olds and 20-year-olds with no disability participated in youth clubs compared to those with a disability.



## INCREASED NATIONAL CHILDCARE SCHEME SUBSIDIES

Since January, subsidies under the National Childcare Scheme increased to €1.40 per hour of childcare, per child. This is an increase of 90c on the previous rate and means that parents using full-time registered early learning and childcare services will benefit from an average 25% reduction in their childcare costs.

elcoming the increased subsidies under the National Childcare Scheme, Minister Roderic O'Gorman said:

"Since being appointed Minister for Children, I made clear my intention to make childcare more affordable for parents, and with this increase in the National Childcare Scheme subsidy, due to the additional €121m I secured in Budget 2023, I am delivering on that promise.

This week, I announced that more than 105,000 children, and their families, are benefitting from the National Childcare Scheme – an increase of 95%


compared to this time last year. I'm delighted that the increased subsidies have led to a huge growth in demand for the NCS, meaning more parents than ever are getting more affordable childcare.

I've spoken to a number of parents across the constituency who have told me how beneficial these increased savings on childcare are for them and their family. Many parents who felt they had to choose between childcare and returning to work have said that they now feel that they can do both. I want to continue supporting families with children, and will be working within Government on how we can bring even further affordability for parents in future budgets."

## MINISTER O'GORMAN LAUNCHES PARENT AND TODDLER GROUP **GRANTS INITIATIVE 2023**

Minister for Children, Disability, Equality, Integration and Youth, Roderic O'Gorman, today launched the Parent and Toddler Group Grants Initiative 2023. The Minister has secured funding of €250,000, which will be allocated to Parent and Toddler Groups nationwide through local City/County Childcare Committees (CCCs). From today, Parent and Toddler Groups are invited to make an application for funding under this Initiative through their local CCC.

supporting Parent and Toddler Groups that offer a welcome to families who are newly arrived in Ireland.

Following from the success of the additional

his year the emphasis will be on i funding streams in last year's Initiative, the Parent and Toddler Group Grants Initiative 2023 will again offer three streams of funding:

> 1. Funding of €800 for existing groups and €1,100 for the establishment of new groups.

2. Funding of up to €300 is available to establish



and operate Buggy Walking Groups. These Buggy Walking Groups are organised social walks for parents/guardians and young children. The grant is open to any existing or new organisations or groups who wish to offer a minimum of six organised walks within their community

3. Additional funding of up to  $\in$ 300 is available for new or existing Parent and Toddler Groups to provide a second session to meet demand.

Conditions apply and the CCCs are available to discuss requirements with new and existing groups.

In announcing this year's Parent and Toddler Grant

#### Minister O'Gorman said:

"Parent and Toddler Groups provide a great meeting place for parents/guardians with young children to relax and chat together in a supportive environment while their children play. I want to thank all the groups that are offering a welcome and friendship to parents and children in their

communities as well as those newly arrived to Ireland. I am delighted to be able to support this work."

Groups, including many Family Resource Centres across the country, have opened their doors to families from Ukraine. Kenmare Family Resource Centre runs a weekly successful and inclusive Parent and Toddler Group.

Máire Ui Leime the Centre's coordinator shared some feedback from Ukrainian parents using the group:

"Ukrainian parents have told me that they find it great to come to the Parent and Toddler Group as it is so welcoming and they can either sit quietly or take part.

"We can forget the war'; 'we can leave our troubles outside the door' and 'it is great to hear the children laughing while playing with other children' are some of the other positive comments."



## Much Needed New Housing and Community Centre Progress Welcomed

Sinn Féin Councillor for Lucan-Palmerstown-Balgaddy & North Clondalkin, Derren Ó Bradaigh, has welcomed the progress underway that will now see the delivery of some long-awaited social housing and a new community centre to be located in the heart of Balgaddy.

llr Ó Brádaigh said;

"Whilst early ground works commenced in January of this year, on site work is now steadily progressing with actual construction soon to begin

and ahead of next week's sod turning ceremony. The project will deliver 69 units, comprising of a mix

of one-, two- and three-bedroom properties. The housing crisis is particularly acute in Dublin Mid-West and these council-built properties will provide desperately needed homes for some families. With the contractor already on site and the construction period approximately 20 months in total, the completion date is expected for August 2024.



"The development will include a badly needed community centre, long sought after by local people and resident groups working and advocating on the needs for greater amenities in the area. Down the years Sinn Féin have worked in support of the residents of Balgaddy and indeed the wider community, to help bring about an improvement in existing living conditions and a better living environment. This has involved working directly with the council's housing and community department to help better inform and deliver upon this overdue project.

"As with the development of any new community facility, it is essential that the council community team engage with residents and community groups to undertake local consultation and to provide a full analysis of community needs in advance of facility usage planning. It is expected that consultation will take place in advance of, and during the early construction of the community centre.

"The existing estate of Balgaddy was built 16 years ago and quickly became a forgotten community,

following the emergence of a litany of structural defects that have continued to blight homes to this day. Progress to address long awaited remedial works, some of the more challenging roof repairs, insulation, electrical and plumbing repairs has been painstakingly slow, but with some results finally beginning to unveil. Initiatives such as the 'Better Blocks' project last year, seeking to empower communities was hugely welcome and need to be broadened out.

"With this new development and extension of Balgaddy finally off the ground, hopefully this will help focus minds further in addressing all the existing challenges and issues faced by residents daily, and equipping the needs of the community both now and into the future through the provision of adequate services, amenities and investment."

### Childcare Services Must Become a Priority in Growing West Dublin Suburb

A Dublin Mid-West Sinn Féin councillor has expressed alarm at the inadequate level of childcare services to meet the needs of families in rapidly expanding parts of the constituency.

ouncillor Derren Ó Brádaigh said; "Whilst population continues to grow amid ongoing development in West Lucan, we are not seeing the arrival of essential childcare services to meet demand in real time. I see childcare services as a public service for both children and parents. When it works, a State's childcare system can be a huge employer; help with health and mental development of our smallest children; facilitate parents, especially women, to access the workforce and be a positive component of economic growth.

"We know that South Dublin's population grew above the national average in both the 2016 and 2022 census counts and is now at 300,000, with close to 60,000 people in Lucan alone. We also know that national and regional plans project a further 50,000 people to live in South Dublin by 2031, and a significant number of these families will take up residency within the strategic development zones of Adamstown and Clonburris.

"Accessible and affordable childcare is a huge issue in many parts of Ireland but has become particularly acute in Lucan now. The limited number of creche facilities are in most instances akin to the cost of a second mortgage, without any availability, even if parents can afford them. At a local area committee meeting last year, I learned that the community team in South Dublin County Council have recently consulted with their planning colleagues to confirm the model used for creche planning. The standards for creches are set out within Childcare Facilities Guidelines for Planning Authorities June 2001 published by the Department. These standards are reflected in the County Development Plan and seek one childcare facility with a minimum of 20 places for each 75 units for new residential development. The reality on the ground and in the community falls far short of anything even near this criterion.

"It is vital that we begin to see new public creche facilities in tandem with the arrival of any further development, that so many young ordinary working parents and families in Lucan now so badly need. Ultimately, I believe we need to invest considerably more in childcare, and early years learning needs to become an essential public service – we should be looking at pre-school and early education being free along the same model as primary school, and when secondary school moved this way in the 1960's. Our children are the next generation and represent the future. It is up to us just what kind of society we wish to see – one restricted by poor services, accessibility and for only those that can afford, or one that will enable entire families to flourish and give back."

## RENEWED CALL FOR PROPERTIES IN KILDARE TO HOUSE PEOPLE FROM UKRAINE

1500 homes offered nationally so far

ildare County Council is renewing a call out to those who have unoccupied properties across the county to offer them as temporary homes for those fleeing war in Ukraine.

'Offer a Home' is part of a government initiative, led by local authorities, to make use of unoccupied houses, apartments or holiday homes to house Ukrainian people and families.

A tax-free recognition payment of €800 per month is available for properties used to house those arriving from Ukraine. More than 70,000 people have arrived to Ireland from Ukraine seeking safety and the vast majority need accommodation.

Under the 'Offer a Home' programme, Kildare County Council will take offers of houses, apartments



:

or holiday homes for temporary accommodation, liaise with owners to assess suitability, and arrange for their use by Ukrainian individuals and families.

Property owners can offer homes at gov.ie/ offerahome or by contacting the local authority in which the property is located. For properties in Kildare, Kildare County Council can be contacted via email at offerahome@kildarecoco.ie

Those who offer a property can expect to be contacted by the local authority within 5 working days of making their offer and an assessment of the property will be carried out by the local authority shortly after. The assessment is to ensure the property is habitable and to get some details so it can be matched to the most appropriate person or family.

Anybody who offers a property will be able to check the status of their offer at any stage through the website www.gov.ie/offerahome.ie

This is a call for stand-alone properties that are not occupied by others. Properties should be in liveable condition and, ideally, available for at least 6 months. While rent will not be payable to those who offer properties, a tax-free recognition payment of  $\in$ 800 per month is available from the Department of Social Protection to those who offer accommodation to Ukrainians.

The Offer a Home programme began in late November last year and to date, more than 1500 offers have been made to local authorities nationally.

Appealing to the people of Kildare to offer unused properties, Kildare County Council said:

"The welcome that Irish people have shown to those arriving from Ukraine has been exceptional, and we are so thankful to those who have already offered homes. We know that people are keen to help where they can so we're appealing to anybody who has a suitable property and hasn't been able to offer it before now to please consider getting in touch with us to find out what is involved.

"We understand that it can be daunting to offer a property to someone you don't know. That is why local authorities will work with you throughout the process and be there to offer support while your property is being used.

"If you have a property that is otherwise going to be empty over the coming months, please consider offering it for those who badly need a safe home for a while."

## **Affordable Housing**

Kildare County Council has issued Advance Notice of a new Affordable Housing Scheme. The Local Authority Affordable Housing Purchase Scheme aims to help people on moderate incomes to buy new homes at reduced prices.

n the coming months, Kildare County Council intends to make new homes available for purchase in Kildare under the Local Authority Affordable Housing Purchase Scheme. In return, Kildare County Council will take a percentage equity interest in the home that covers the reduction in price.

The scheme is aimed at first-time buyers, but there are some exceptions for fresh start applicants.

#### You are a first-time buyer if:

• You have not previously bought or built a property to live in

• You do not own or have an interest in any property in Ireland or abroad

#### You are a fresh start applicant if:

• You previously owned a home, but you no longer have a financial interest in it because:

• You are now divorced, separated, or your relationship has ended

• You have gone through personal insolvency or bankruptcy

Eligible applicants are encouraged to take the time during this advance notice period to familiarise themselves with the application process and documentation, such as Mortgage Approval in Principle are advised. A minimum deposit of 10% of the purchase price of the property will also be required.

An online application system will be available as each affordable housing scheme is launched, meaning, there is no general application form or waiting list.

Eligible applicants can use the Local Authority Home Loan or a mortgage from any private lending institution, to finance their purchase.

## NEW FULLY ACCESSIBLE 'CHANGING PLACES' FACILITY **OPENS IN NEWBRIDGE**

### Second Facility Installed by Kildare County Council

Kildare County Council has today opened a second fully accessible 'Changing Places' facility for people with complex disabilities. Located in Newbridge Sports Centre, Station Road, Newbridge, the facility includes many features and additional equipment making it more accessible than the standard accessible toilets we are all familiar with.

ewbridge is the location of the second Changing Places facility to be opened by Kildare County Council following the launch of the facility in the Council Offices, Devoy Park,

Naas last year.

Disabled accessible toilets often do not meet the needs of all people with complex disabilities. For example, individuals with conditions such as cerebral palsy, spina bifida, multiple sclerosis, and older people with physical disabilities may need extra equipment facilities to enable them to use the toilet, maximising independence, and comfort. Sadly, many people with disabilities are often faced with the indignity and unhygienic option of being changed on the floor of a public toilet as the correct facilities are not available in public places.

The Changing Places facility addresses these issues as it provides 12m<sup>2</sup> of floor space and includes both a full room coverage ceiling track hoist, a centrally located toilet bowl with space It will open up the world for many people with

either side for transfers or assistants, and a heightadjustable adult sized changing bench.

Changing Places facilities are designed to enhance the health, safety, comfort, and dignity of someone who may need extra support and additional equipment during personal care tasks. Changing Places facilities also offer added safety and support features for assistants.

Speaking at the opening of the new facility, Michael Hurley, Access Officer, Kildare County Council said; "I am incredibly excited about the opening of this new state of the art public service facility for people with disabilities and additional This new facility represents physical needs. another significant step forward and is a positive contribution to the full inclusion, equality, and rights of disabled people within our community.

Aisling McNiffe, Changing Places Ireland said; "We are delighted to see that Newbridge Sports Centre have installed a changing places toilet.




disabilities. Accessibility and inclusion are vital. To be able to access a bathroom suitable for your individual needs is a basic human right. So many people have been excluded from society because of the lack of a changing places toilet. Thanks to Michael Hurley & Kildare County Council for their commitment to date."

Speaking about her own family's experience, Aisling added; "I am writing this on behalf of my son Jack who has an intellectual & physical disability. He does not get to participate in the world as most of us do, he is restricted by his mobility and always has been. He is nearing 18 years old and I hope the future will be brighter for him & his friends. He deserves to be able to access the world just as the majority of us do. He deals with so much on a day-to-day basis & something as basic as an appropriate toilet/ bathroom would change his life. This is a human rights issue. We need to give children & adults like my son respect and dignity. Providing an appropriate bathroom is just the start."

The Changing Places facility in Newbridge Sports Centre is now open to the public and is the second in a series of 3 planned facilities with another one planned for the new library in Naas.


