Absolutely Disgraceful that 1,755 Dublin Carers had Carers Allowance Removed from them Last Year

Aontú Cllr for Ongar on Fingal County Council, Gerard Sheehan, has said that it is 'absolutely disgraceful' that over almost 15,000 family carers in Co Dublin have had their allowance payments removed from them over the past decade.

peaking today, Cllr Sheehan said: "Even if we allow for the fact that in some of these cases the payments were stopped because the patient died, I'm aware of many cases where

the payment was withdrawn because the patient did a stint in hospital, or because the spouse of the carer received a small pay rise in their employment.

Aontú are working hard in the Dáil to end the means test for the carer's allowance. Most of the carers in this country are women - it's not fair that the State would threaten to take the allowance away from them on the basis that their husband gets a pay increase".

Cllr Sheehan continued: "What the government need to realise is that caring is often a full-time job. Carers often have sleepless nights as they provide round the clock care to their loved ones. They deserve to be paid a wage for the work they're doing".

"In County Dublin last year 1,755 carers had their payments stopped. Without family carers, and the great work that they do out of a place of love, the structures of this country would collapse - nursing homes would run out of space, the homecare providers would not be able to cope with demand and the entire system would collapse.

Aontú will continue to work hard to get rid of the means test and to ensure that carers are treated with the respect and financial supports that they deserve", concluded Sheehan.

Dear Resident

I am giving updates on a few issues which I have been working on over the summer. Please don't hesitate to contact me if I can be of any assistance.

CLONSILLA FRAMEWORK PLAN

The draft urban framework plan for Clonsilla is expected to go out on public consultation in September for a four week period. This plan is a major opportunity to secure public realm improvements, protect local heritage and enhance the village of Clonsilla.

The first stage of the Master Plan for the Old School House will also commence in September with a pre-draft consultation which will allow residents and community groups to have their say on the future of the Old School House lands. Both plans have to be completed before April 2025 in line with a commitment which I secured as part of the Fingal Development Plan.

DART+ WEST RAILWAY ORDER APPROVED

An Bord Pleanala issued the Railway Order for DART +West on 18th July, authorising Irish Rail to construct the DART extension from Dublin city to Maynooth and the M3 Parkway. While electrification of the Maynooth line is long overdue, there are outstanding issues to be resolved in the detailed design and construction phase.

Several positive changes were included in the Railway Order by Irish Rail following representations which I and other observers made at the oral hearing, including lifts to ensure accessibility at Ashtown, Coolmine and Clonsilla stations and reduction of the footprint, length and visual impact of the new pedestrian bridges at these locations. I am seeking clarification from Irish Rail on the impact of the works on the road network due to the closure of level crossings. I have also asked Irish Rail to change its plan for the underpass at Ashtown to protect the viability of Ashtown Stables and to adopt an alternative solution to the proposed temporary road into Ashleigh estate.

ONGAR TAKING IN CHARGE

The taking in charge of Ongar is proceeding and the latest areas to be taken in charge are Willan's estate and the streets in Ongar village itself, including Ongar Square, which are to be advertised for taking in charge in August. The taking in charge will include the car parking spaces in these areas.

CRISIS IN SPECIAL EDUCATION IN DUBLIN 15

The special needs education crisis in Dublin 15 has been apparent for six years and despite repeated promises from the Department and NCSE, the same problems of lack of appropriate school places and non-existent support services keep getting worse year after year. While the Department of Education has announced the formation of new special classes in recent weeks, this is not enough, as many students already in mainstream classes in schools need access to these classes and there are currently 20 children in Dublin 15 who do not have school places for the coming year in September 2024.



Children, parents and educators have been abandoned by state agencies for too long and schools have been left to their own devices to provide for vulnerable children while being denied essential services, training and supports.

It is scandalous that parents have to fight every step of the way to get an appropriate school place for their child and that all too frequently, parents don't know whether they have a place until just before the start of the school year. If parents have to rely on home tuition for their children in September, this will be a devastating failure by all the state agencies.

We need radical change to fix the system, not ad hoc or fragmented actions year after year. Ministers have to insist that addressing the neglect of children with additional educational needs is put at the top of the political agenda. We need:

- Long-term planning on a multi-year basis to ensure that every child with additional needs has an appropriate place in school.
- Prioritise a new building for Danu Community Special School and deliver essential modular accommodation urgently for both new and existing students.
- Create two new Children's Disability Network Teams (CDNTs) in Dublin 15 to ensure timely support and early intervention for children with additional needs.
- Implement the School Inclusion Model which offers a holistic range of supports to schools and teachers as a regional pilot project across County Dublin.
- Restore the special education teaching hours which are being reduced in 2024-25 for 68% of schools in Dublin 15.

Castleknock TidyTowns - Latest news

It's been a busy year for Castleknock TidyTowns (CTT) so far with lots happening around the village. This is the sixth year CTT volunteers have worked each and every Saturday (April through October) to keep Castleknock village looking so well.



TT recently operated a Poster-Free Zone (PFZ) for the referendums held in March followed by the Local and European elections held in June. We had been working on this project for the previous twelve months and communicated extensively with all the candidates and parties. We received excellent support, and the initiative was a resounding success.

CTT's main purpose is to protect the historic heritage Castleknock Village so the PFZ is confined to a short stretch through the village plus limited sections of the approach roads.

Our three main objectives for putting the PFZ in place are:

- · To address climate change and sustainability
- To prevent littering and obstruction of public infrastructure
- The safety of pedestrians and cyclists

Feedback from local residents was overwhelmingly in Bike. Our volunteers are putting this bike to great use, favour of the initiative. We intend to continue with the transporting plants, tools and watering buckets as well as

PFZ initiative for the upcoming General Election due to be held by March 2025 and indeed for all future elections and referendums.

Very importantly we are putting forward a novel suggestion to Fingal County Council (FCC) to use Castleknock to test a pilot project for the next General Election whereby, in return for candidates adhering to the PFZ, FCC would erect a large poster board (perhaps even an electronic one) in a central prominent location close to the village where every candidate could display one poster with their details/ policies. This practice is very common in many European countries and if the pilot project was successful in Castleknock it could be rolled out throughout the country. We look forward to the cooperation of FCC in trialling this novel pilot project which would eliminate the need for hundreds of posters and cable ties.

CTT has gone Electric! with great support from FCC Active Travel Department. We now have an E-Cargo Bike. Our volunteers are putting this bike to great use, transporting plants, tools and watering buckets as well as green waste, leaves and loam to our composting bays. This initiative reduces the green waste collected by FCC, lowers our carbon footprint, and enriches our local soil.

'Rediscovering Cycling in Castleknock' was another focal point of our Active Travel efforts. Local residents participated in a 6-week course, rekindling their love for cycling and enjoyed some lovely evening cycles through the beautiful Phoenix Park.

Additionally, the children at Castleknock Educate Together National School (CETNS) have embraced Active Travel with 'Fresh Air Fridays' initiative, where they walk or cycle to school.

We continue to make strides towards making a positive difference to our environment.

CTT Coffee Morning raised over €5,000

Sincerest thanks to everyone who attended and supported the CTT fundraising coffee morning recently. TRAD 15, the talented group of local musicians played at the event and proved to be extremely popular. Many thanks to TRAD 15 and the CTT volunteers for helping to create this upbeat community event.

More benches secured

CTT has worked closely with FCC to provide benches on green spaces within residential estates. 14 new benches have been provided by Fingal Operations across Castleknock between 2022 and 2023. A further four benches have already been provided this year, in

Park Drive, College Grove and Castleknock Park and another four are due to be installed later this summer, in the Georgian Village, Woodview,

Deerpark and College Road.

This project, which was initiated by CTT, has delivered new public infrastructure that is functional, sustainable, and visually attractive: this promotes universal accessibility for green spaces and allows for greater enjoyment of local amenities by residents of all ages.

Poly tunnel purchased

After a long quest for a location, Castleknock Lawn Tennis Club very kindly agreed to allow CTT to locate a poly tunnel within their grounds. Brady's of Castleknock agreed to provide a water supply. Some funding was provided by FCC, and more was raised through a GoFundMe page to help purchase and equip the poly tunnel. The greenhouse will be used to propagate pollinator-friendly annual and perennial plants from seeds and cuttings. The ground around the poly tunnel will also be used to grow immature trees in pots, prior to planting them out in Castleknock in a few years' time. Thanks to everyone who has supported this project to date. We are most grateful! This poly tunnel will be a sustainability and environmental win for our area. CTT is committed to being a self-sustaining entity and this poly tunnel will be a significant step along that journey.



brand new outdoor climbing frame and a host of new balance bikes, trikes, scooters and more for the children at Home-Start.



LORD CHESTERFIELD AND IRELAND By Mike Power

Have you ever wondered about the tall monument you meet when driving out or in the Castleknock gate...? This dates from 1745-46 and was erected to the memory of an English viceroy to Ireland, Lord Chesterfield in 1745.

his was erected by public subscription to thank him for opening up the park to the public.

Formerly, this whole area had been private to the military e.g. the Magazine Fort (1736) and the Royal Hibernian Military School, to educate the children of officers serving abroad. The office of the Irish Ordinance Survey was also located there in 1825. There were also many houses of Irish grandees living on the demesne.

The Monument.

The monument, which is of Portland stone over Corinthian columns and surmounted by a phoenix, contributes to the name the name of the park itself. Originally this monument was located in the very centre of the park but was moved in the 1830s to its present position of prominence.

But what of the man who erected it? Well, Chesterfield was an English politician and diplomat who was English Viceroy in Ireland for 1745-46. Chesterfield had already a political and ambassadorial (Holland 1728) career behind him before setting foot on our shores.

He entered the House of Lords in 1715 as Lord Stanhope of Shelford.

Unfortunately, he was recognised as not being of age to serve, was fined £500 (about EU:40,000 now) and had to flee to the continent to escape from his debtors !

He was awarded the Order of the Garter (1730 see pic) as a reward for services to the State.

He came to Ireland in the year in which another great advocate for Ireland died , Jonathan Swift .

.Chesterfield was a great admirer of the French language and culture and corresponded regularly with leading intellectuals of the day such as Voltaire, Montesquieu and Condorcet.

Chesterfield was a witty, erudite and totally practical person, well-used to the tricky ways of the world. In his younger days ,he was an inveterate gambler and married a rich German heiress in 1733 to improve his perilous financial position. On arriving in Ireland some wag asked Chesterfield why he had such a small staff accompanying him.?

'Why', he retorted 'it's because I intend to do all the work myself....!'

And so he DID!

Chesterfield was an anomaly among British statesmen of that day, he actually liked Ireland and Irish people, and he was determined to improve the lot of both during his time as Viceroy. He immediately identified the twin evils of the Penal Laws and oppressive control from Dublin castle as requiring reform. During his short stay in Ireland, Chesterfield founded schools, actively promoted better industries and farm-practices here, and contributed to the setting up of the many charitable institutions.

Improving the Park

Chesterfield had a great impact on the history of the Phoenix Park. It was typical of him that he wanted to bequeath an open air and pleasant recreation ground to all his Irish subjects .He also encouraged many landscape works there , including tree-planting along the avenue named for him (Chesterfield Ave.) .This completed , he then formally opened up the park to everyone. .(and much to the annoyance of the resident grandees !).

Chesterfield's Letters to his son

One of the things Chesterfield is best known for now, are his famous Letters to His Son (1745-'73). He wanted his son to quickly learn the 'ways of the world' so he could advance in his career ,and wrote him many letters containing the gist of his hard-won, and distilled wisdom about life and living. He dealt with every trial of life and how to curry favour and survive through it with graceful manners. Unfortunately, Chesterfield's son was congenitally indolent and benefitted little from this advice..Letters to his Godson were aimed at a more receptive target...

Chesterfield died in 1773, aged 79 yrs.He will always be remembered as a friend of Ireland – an enlightened ruler who only wanted the best for his people. Think kindly of the old statesman , painfully tottering out his gouty final days , courageous to the end, when you next drive pass his monument....

BACK TO SCHOOL COSTS A FINANCIAL BURDEN FOR 62% OF PARENTS



The Irish League of Credit Unions (ILCU) has published the 2024 results of its annual Back to School survey which tracks the costs and impacts of children returning to school as well as broader cost of living factors.

he 2024 research has found that 62% of parents say that covering the cost of back to school is a financial burden. Commenting on the 2024 findings, David Malone, CEO, Irish League of Credit Unions said; "This year's back to school survey findings are very insightful as they show that Government initiatives such as the Free School Books scheme do seem to have eased the financial burden for some families. However, there is a still an onerous cost burden on parents with increasing levels of associated debt linked to schooling and the cost of living.

"The 2024 research shows that 28%, more than 1 in 4, of parents are taking on debt to cover back to school costs, with the average debt amount at €368, which is an increase of €62 on the same figure last year. The issue of debt is significant, and it should be noted that 32% of parents in debt have debts of over €500 to cover these costs."

Mr Malone continued, "Theses costs and credit union."

increasing levels of debt have a knock-on effect as our 2024 research shows that 46%, almost half, of parents of school children who've been affected by the Cost of Living since the start of 2024 say they've cancelled or reduced nonessential service or activities to cover rising costs, and 23% are trying to earn additional income. Added to this, our research found that 86% of parents with schoolchildren say their income or household costs have been affected by rising costs of living, with 91% of those affected experiencing additional grocery costs and 89% seeing additional costs to utility bills.

"Overall, we want parents of both primary and secondary students to know, credit unions are here to help plan out and manage these expenses. As not-for-profit organisations, established in communities all across Ireland, we understand the impact of these important costs on households, and we would encourage anyone who has concerns to talk to their local credit union."

How old do you guess the Dublin 15 suburb of Ashtown is...? Ancient, middle-aged, or modern...? Well in fact, this particular area only appears on old maps of some 100 years ago !

shtown, bounded to the North by the Phoenix Park and to the south and west by Castleknock and Cabra, is largely a modern creation of two of the most important developments of the Victorian age ,i.e. the railways and the Royal Canal. However, both of these technological innovations suffered very contrasting fortunes as we'll later see. In the past, this sparsely populated area has been a home to the mansions of wealthier Co Dublin citizens, reveiling in the largely agricultural rolling countryside and in the unspoilt (but then closed off !) Phoenix Park. Ashtown House , built 1830

in the fashionable Italianate style of that day, is one of these

mansions remaining.

Today's Ashtown is a vibrant, attractive, and cosmopolitan suburb with lots to attract both residents and visitors alike. And population growth figures attest to this area's undoubted popularity. In 2006 some 7,715 lived here. By 2022, this had risen to 12,012, almost doubling the number of inhabitants. This growth has been driven by tasteful building schemes such as Rathbone, Royal Canal Park, Ashington and Pellettstown, among others. Efficient communications, a pleasant living environment, proximity to the Phoenix Park, and escalating house-equity have all contributed to Ashtown's popularity today

Technological Developments.

Ashtown is located on the Dublin-Sligo railway and the original local station here was opened in 1902.



Pellettstown Station.

With the opening of Dublin's newest railway station, Pellettstown, in Sept 2021, and with 94 trains scheduled on weekdays, local commuters found themselves within a convenient 12-minute journey time to the city centre.

Ashtown is also sited on the 10th lock of the Royal Canal. This massive public works began in 1790, the first stretch being built from Phibsborough to Ashtown. The final cost of this 'white elephant' scheme was some 1,421,954 pounds, many Eu 10s of millions in today's money. Not unexpectedly, the company soon went bankrupt and the coming of the railways in the 1840s sealed its final demise.

Today, the canal serves a purpose very different from its original creators, though no less important for that, i.e. that of brightening the lifestyles of its local inhabitants on their walks.

Sir Rowan Hamilton

If you happen to notice a brass plaque while walking over Broombridge bridge, this commemorates the discovery in 1843 by Sir William Ronan Hamilton of the formula for quaternions while taking his regular evening stroll. Hamilton was an Irish polymath whose work paved the way for quantum mechanics and this monument is still revered by many of today's foreign visiting scientists.

The Secret of Ashtown Castle.

Another attractive heritage feature for locals close to the park is the Visitor Centre.

For centuries Ashtown Castle was an undiscovered secret, one only brought to light when a surrounding Georgian building was demolished in 1978. To the builder's utter amazement, an undiscovered 1430s tower castle lay revealed within . This is the oldest structure yet found within the Phoenix Park. It was built under an English parliamentary grant of 10 Pounds given to colonial settlers in the crown's attempt to civilise ' this wild and barbarous country.' The present building, beautifully restored by our own Bord of Works, boasts a Victorian kitchen garden and many beautiful walks within Ashtown demense.

The structure had been the official residence of the British Under-Secretary from 1782. This building, then called Ashtown Lodge, was also home to the Papal Nuncio until the 1970s. This castle is now identified as the oldest building within the Phoenix park and has a treasured place in the hearts of all local 'Ashtowners' and visitors alike. A must-see if you're ever in the area.

Yes, blessed with its rich heritage , beautiful walks, and modern infrastructure, Ashtown has certainly come on since it's small beginning in the 1900s...

DART CELEBRATES 40 YEARS IN 2024



Dublin's renowned DART service celebrated its 40th anniversary this July. Since its launch on July 23, 1984, the DART has facilitated nearly 670 million passenger journeys. To commemorate this milestone, Irish Rail revealed a special livery at Grand Canal Station.

he uniquely wrapped DART train features a vibrant timeline of significant moments and events from Dublin and Irish life over the past 40 years. Curated by the Little Museum of Dublin, the special collection of images adorning the exterior and interior of the carriages includes references to iconic elements such as Bosco, Brexit, the Millennium milk bottle, and Marriage Equality.

Renowned author Roddy Doyle contributed to the celebrations with an exclusive short film that follows his beloved "Two Pints" characters on a whimsical "DORT" journey to the southside. Created for the 40th anniversary, the film reflects Doyle's strong connection to the DART, with scenes from the adaptation of his first novel, The Commitments, filmed at Kilbarrack DART station in the early '90s.

The festivities at Grand Canal Dock were kicked off by 80's icon Bosco, with Transport Minister Eamon Ryan also in attendance. Minister Ryan remarked on the DART's longevity, stating, "It's hard to believe that the DART is 40 years old, and yet it seems as if it has been here forever."

He continued, "Spanning our majestic Dublin Bay, originally from Howth to Bray and now extending from Malahide to Greystones, the DART has been integral to the lives of many Dubliners. It has been a backdrop for numerous celebrated books, films, music videos, and stories of Dublin life, both fictional and real."

Minister Ryan recalled that the DART was initially criticized as a "Rolls Royce" solution, deemed too extravagant for the city's needs. However, the decision to proceed proved wise. Initially serving about 25,000 passengers daily, the DART now accommodates close to 90,000, with plans for expansion north to Drogheda, west to Maynooth, and south to Wicklow Town. Ryan expressed excitement about the DART's future, emphasizing its role in Dubliners' lives.

Ciaran O'Brien from Drumcondra, who worked on the DART for over 20 years, shared his fond memories, saying, "There was great teamwork. The people of Dublin embraced the DART, and the workers truly enjoyed being part of it. It's now a crucial part of Dublin's infrastructure, and I'm hopeful for its continued expansion and the shift towards clean, electrified transport."

Jim Meade, Chief Executive of larnród Éireann, hailed the DART as Ireland's "greatest public transport success story." He highlighted the significance of the DART's launch during the economically challenging 1980s, proving that investment in highquality public transport garners community support. Meade looks forward to the DART's ongoing success and growth, ensuring that rail remains the backbone of Ireland's sustainable transport network for the future.



EASY VEGETARIAN LASAGNE



INGREDIENTS

3 red peppers, cut into large chunks 2 aubergines, cut into 1/2 cm thick slices 8 tbsp olive oil, plus extra for the dish 300g lasagne sheets 125g mozzarella handful cherry tomatoes, halved For the tomato sauce 1 tbsp olive oil 2 onions, finely chopped 2 garlic cloves, sliced 1 carrot, roughly chopped 2 tbsp tomato purée 200ml white wine 3 x 400g cans chopped tomatoes 1 bunch of basil, leaves picked For the white sauce 85g butter 85g plain flour 750ml milk

METHOD

STEP 1

To make the tomato sauce, heat the olive oil in a saucepan. Add the onions, garlic and carrot. Cook for 5-7 mins over a medium heat until softened. Turn up the heat a little and stir in the tomato purée. Cook for 1 min, pour in the white wine, then cook for 5 mins until this has reduced by two-thirds. Pour over the chopped tomatoes and add the basil leaves. Bring to the boil then simmer for 20 mins. Leave to cool then whizz in a food processor. Will keep, cooled, in the fridge for up to three days or frozen for three months.

STEP 2

To make the white sauce, melt the butter in a saucepan, stir in the plain flour, then cook for 2 mins. Slowly whisk in the milk, then bring to the boil, stirring. Turn down the heat, then cook until the sauce starts to thicken and coats the back of a wooden spoon. Will keep, cooled, in the fridge for up to three days or frozen for three months.

STEP 3

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Lightly oil two large baking trays and add the peppers and aubergines. Toss with the olive oil, season well, then roast for 25 mins until lightly browned.

STEP 4

Reduce the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Lightly oil a 30 x 20cm ovenproof dish. Arrange a layer of the vegetables on the bottom, then pour over a third of the tomato sauce. Top with a layer of lasagne sheets, then drizzle over a quarter of the white sauce. Repeat until you have three layers of pasta.

STEP 5

Spoon the remaining white sauce over the pasta, making sure the whole surface is covered, then scatter over the mozzarella and cherry tomatoes. Bake for 45 mins until bubbling and golden.



The extended range rear-wheel drive (RWD) model comes with a 286hp electric motor, allowing it to sprint from 0-100km/h in 6.4 seconds. This model's 77kWh battery provides a WLTP range of up to 627km.

Both models support DC charging, with the RWD charging up to 135kW and the AWD up to 185kW. According to Ford, both can charge from 10-80% capacity in less than 30 minutes.

The interior of the new Capri is described as luxurious, featuring a minimalist digital design with soft-touch materials and sculpted one-piece front seats. Standard high-spec comfort features include keyless entry and start, heated front seats and steering wheel, dual-zone climate control, and a driver's seat with massage and memory function.
