Tyrrelstown Boulevard Road Renovation

Glad that my representation resulted in the Fingal County Council have taken the bond for rehabilitation of some damaged roundabouts along the Boulevard in Tyrrelstown. Thanks to the operation team of the Fingal County Council for the effecting the important repairs.



TAKING IN CHARGE UPDATES

Heathfield Estate

For the purposes of taking in charge, the following enhancements have been made. I am delighted that roadworks upgrade, footpath repairs, manhole clean-up as well as the removal of the rotten and broken wooden fencing along the perimeter fencing of the estate now gives a welcome face-lift and further prepare the estate for taking-in-charge. More work are expected on the playground and the boarded area at the main entrance.



Mount Eustace and Cruise Park

both Mount Eustace and Cruise Park and have tendered for a contractor who will hopefully be starting work in November in both estates. Kerbing and footpath works are required to bring the estates up to standard. Once the works are complete, the council will be able to take both of estates in charge.

Bellingsmore, Baymeadows, Hollywoodrath & Brandon Square

It is hoped that with recent works done, Bay Meadows will be advertised shortly and will be taken in charge in January. Bellingsmore is quite close with a few works to be done. The developer of Hollywoodrath still has some works to do to bring the state up to full standard. Brandon Square is also in consideration.

I am happy to give further updates if residents require specific information.

Addressing Blocked drainages & Litter concern in Meakstown and environ.

Following representations raised the operations team effected the clearance of drainages to remedy flooding risks in Lanesborough and Charlestown. These areas have remained cleared since.





The operations team also carried out cleanup in the Meakstown, Lanesborough, Melville, Charlestown and environ where there had been high cases of litter. These areas were thereafter included in the litter picking schedule. The areas are now kept monitored and litter picked as required. It is important to note however that the area outside McDonalds and the Jamestown Road is not under the remit of Fingal County Council. This area is in the administrative area of Dublin City Council. Clean-up equipment for the Meakstown Community Council.

Solar Compactor Bins in Meakstown

There are 8 solar compactor bins distributed in the Fingal County Council area of Meakstown and these include:

There are currently 8 solar bins assigned to the Meakstown area, with 7 in operation at present. The locations are: Ikea Bus Stop; Circle K Ballymun Road Bus Stop; Charlestown Shopping Centre Bus Stop; Spar Meakstown Centre; Melville Road Bus Stop at UPS; Ballymun Road Bus Stop; Melville Road/North Road Bus Stop; Melville Road South Bus Stop.



Cost of Living Lump sum payments announced in Budget 2024

Below are some of the Lump sum payments announced in Budget 2024:

On the week commencing November 20th

For some's purposes, Christmas enhancements

- €400 lump sum Working Family Payment will be paid to 46,000 families.
- €300 Fuel Allowance Lump Sum Payment will be paid to 409.000 families.
- €400 Disability Support Lump Sum Payment will be paid to people with disabilities.

On the week commencing November 27th

- €400 Carer's Support Grant will be provided to the country's carers (a person who qualifies for both the Disability and the Carers Support Grant will receive one bonus payment of €400).
- €200 lump sum payment to the 237,000 people in receipt of the Living Alone Allowance.
- €100 cost of living lump sum payment per child for people receiving an increase for a Qualified Child on their social welfare payment.

On the week commencing December 4th

- Christmas Bonus Double Payment will be paid to over 1.3 million people.
- · On the 5th of December a Doubling of Child Benefit which will support 650,000 families in respect of 1.2 million children will be paid.

On the week commencing 29th January 2024

 A January Double Payment will be paid to over 1.3 million people.

SNUGBOROUGH INTERCHANGE UPDATE

I recently asked about the completion of the Snugborough Interchange and received the following update from the project team:

Question: Councillor J. Walsh

"To ask the Chief Executive to provide an update on the time-scale and programme for completion of the Snugborough interchange and to clarify when it will be opened?"

Reply:

The Snugborough Interchange is currently programmed to be completed above road level in early December. This will facilitate traffic across the new bridge including cars, bicycles and pedestrians. The work on completing the underpasses will be the last element of the works and will be completed during Q1 next year, as we have included additional elements in the scheme such as repairs to the access to Waterville Park and a new artwork in the underpass. Some traffic management will be required over the coming weeks and resurfacing of the N3 off ramp will be carried out overnight.

At a recent site meeting the project team also clarified that:

- The Tolka Valley park path is due to reopen in November.
- · Blacktop road surfacing works are expected to be completed in early December.
- · New traffic signals switch on early in 2024.
- Works at underpass pathway level are expected to be completed in first quarter of 2024

WORKS ON CLONSILLA ROAD

It is very positive that Fingal Council has undertaken repair work on the surface of the Clonsilla Road close to the junction with Main St, Blanchardstown Village. Following representations from residents and Blanchardstown Tidy Towns, I had submitted a request for this work to be undertaken as the road surface was badly damaged and dangerous.



ILLEGAL DUMPING

The scale of illegal dumping of litter and domestic rubbish is a scourge for communities across Dublin 15, which has intensified during and after Covid. Until recently it has been impossible to use CCTV to monitor and prosecute illegal dumping. My Labour Party colleague, Senator Mark Wall, brought forward private members' legislation in 2021 to give a legal basis for use of CCTV to prosecute cases involving illegal dumping and this proposal was included by the Government in the Circular Economy legislation. The Local Government Management Agency has been preparing a code of practice to allow this to come into effect since mid 2022 - this work is long overdue and should be completed and signed off by the Minister for the Environment as soon as possible.




PROPOSED PEDESTRIAN-CYCLE LINK CLOSE TO GRANARD BRIDGE

I recently asked the Planning department of Fingal Council to confirm the timeline and process for a pedestrian-cycle link across the rail line and Royal Canal adjacent to Granard Bridge. The bridge is currently unsafe for pedestrians, cyclists and people with mobility difficulties and a new pedestrian-cycle bridge is badly needed. This is all the more crucial as the current plans for extension of the DART to Maynooth proposes an increase of up to 40% in traffic along Castleknock Road.

The response from the Chief Executive gives a commitment that a new bridge will be put in place and a tender process is being initiated as part of an overall framework for new pedestrian and cycling projects in Dublin 15.

Reply from Chief Executive:

...The initial project on this framework to be progressed will be the Pedestrian and Cycling Bridge at Granard Bridge, Castleknock Road, Castleknock. This new Pedestrian and Cycling Bridge will cross over both the Royal Canal and the Dublin-Maynooth Railway Line. This will form part of the Castleknock to Blanchardstown Pedestrian and Cycling Route. The timeline for appointment of an Engineering Consultant for this project is envisaged for Q1 2024.

It's that time of year when we are endlessly picking up leaves in our gardens. Why does this happen?

n Autumn, loads of plants (particularly trees) discard their leaves. These are perfect for hopping in, however for what reason do plants do this? It appears to be a waste. However, by dropping their leaves they are saving their supplements for the following summer. For plants to develop, they need daylight, supplements, and water. The supplements and water come from the dirt. The daylight is caught by the leaves.

To catch the daylight, the leaves utilize a compound called chlorophyll, which makes leaves green. Chlorophyll transforms daylight into food, which the trees need to develop, through a cycle called photosynthesis. In summer, plants do loads of photosynthesis, since they get bunches of light and on the ground that it is warm.

The food they make is sugar, which they use to develop new leaves, blossoms, and seeds.

In winter, things are less agreeable. The days get more limited, it gets colder and there is less daylight. As far as you might be concerned, this isn't an issue - on the off chance that you are cold, you can put a coat on. Be that as it may, plants can't do this. Furthermore, when it gets truly cold, and freezes, their leaves can be harmed.

To see how freezing treats various leaves, there is an examination you can attempt at home. Take a few distinct leaves and put them in your cooler, or the refrigerator in your ice chest. Pass on them for a day to get truly cool, then take them out once more. Put them on a plate so you don't make a wreck, then, at that point, simply hang tight for them to heat up (this will take some time).

A Bus Service for the Phoenix Park



The new '99' Phoenix Park Bus has been launched. 

he clocks have gone back an hour. Pedestrians to be more visible to others while using the road. This time of year, we experience dark mornings and longer dark evenings, which bring additional hazards to road users.

A simple garment such as a high visibility vest or an armband could be a lifesaver when it comes to making yourself visible on the roads. The main purpose of a high-viz vest is to make the wearer stand out from the background so they can be seen more easily, particularly by drivers or other road users. Hi-Viz vests are effective in any light or weather conditions.

wearing high visibility clothing such as Hi-Viz vests and reflective armbands in addition to the front and rear lights on their bike.

Analysis released from the RSA reports that 43 pedestrians were killed on Irish Roads in 2022. Of the 43 pedestrians killed, 15 occurred between 4pm and 8pm, and 8 between midnight and 4am. Last year, 10 pedestrian fatalities occurred in the month of November.

Initial figures from An Garda Síochána show there have been 38 pedestrian deaths on Irish roads so far this year. The highest in 15 years.

As the winter months bring harsher weather conditions and Cyclists are also urged to be clearly visible to road users by : less daylight, road users are urged to be safe and to be seen.



Continued Investment Reduces Childcare Costs by Minister Roderic O'Gorman

Since becoming Minister for Children, I have been focused on cutting the cost of childcare for parents, increasing the level of investment in early years services to support providers and improving pay levels for childcare professionals, to recognise the real value of the work that they do.



he changes I've led represent the most farreaching reform program for childcare ever undertaken in this country. Yearly investment has grown by 70% - from €638m when I took office in 2020 to €1.1 billion in 2024.

Two years ago, I set out an ambition to halve childcare costs, recognising the huge expense they represent for so many parents. In Budget 2023 last year, I took the first step towards this, increasing the National Childcare Scheme subsidy to reduce parents fees by 25%.

Through new measures announced in Budget 2024 a few weeks ago, by September of next year, the ambition will be a reality. This Government will have cut childcare fees in half, benefiting tens of thousands of families across the country.

While advancing universal policies like this, the measures I have taken have equality at their core, because affordable childcare will count for little if our most vulnerable citizens don't have access to it.

That is why I have provided an additional €14 million to support children with a disability accessing early learning and care through the AIMs programme. This will allow children with a disability to access early years beyond ECCE hours and out of term time.


It is also why I was proud to announce a brand new initiative— the Equal Participation Model — a DEIS inspired model for childcare. This will target investment

and supports for childcare services who cater for children from disadvantaged backgrounds and minority groups.

Another important achievement in the recent Budget is that parents who use registered childminders will be able to start to benefit from the National Childcare Scheme subsidies from September 2024. I know that childminders provide extra flexibility to many parents, and it is important that we support parents in terms of the particular childcare choices they make for their kids.

In 2022, I introduced a new source of financial support for childcare services – Core Funding – recognising the real pressures that many services face. In Budget 2024, I have been able to secure an additional €44m for Year 3 of Core Funding. This will support services to increase pay for childcare professionals, meet additional cost of living pressures and support growth in capacity. I have also indicated I will use some of this additional money to continue measures I began in last years budget to support smaller services.

A child's early years are their most formative. Achieving the very best quality of early learning and care for children gives them the best start in life. I'm pleased to be able to continue to invest in childcare services, in the staff who run them and also to support parents access affordable childcare. All of this will benefit child across Ireland – now and into the future.

GETTING TO KNOW IRELAND

Dublin is the capital city, the centre of government and so much more. The city is a draw to Irish people and international visitors. That said, how many Dubliners have explored their own country?



reland features regularly in travel guides as one of the best places in the world to visit. Many of the places featured are outside Dublin and many Dubliners have never seen them. In coming issues, we will feature places you really should see if you have not already.

This time we feature Slieve League Cliffs in Co Donegal

Rising almost 2000 ft / 598 m from the Atlantic Ocean, Slieve League is known as one of the highest sea cliffs in Europe. There is no doubt that it is one of the most magnificent views in Ireland.

Slieve League is almost three times the height of its Clare cousins, the Cliffs of Moher and whilst standing at the viewing point on the Cliff an amazing sea vista and landscape opens up before your eyes. From this point you can see across Donegal Bay to neighbouring counties Leitrim, Sligo and Mayo and when looking out to the west the view is of the vast Atlantic Ocean as far as the eye can see. From the Northwest you will be able to see Rathlin O'Byrne Island and Glencolmcille. At the base of the Cliffs, you need to look out for the 'Giants Desk and Chair' which is a key part of history.

Aswell as these magnificent views, Slieve League and its surrounding areas are enriched with years of local history and heritage. From Slieve League, you can see Benbulbin which has megalithic tombs and mythical links as far back as Finn McCool. Below Knoch na Rí at Carrowmore is where you can find one of the oldest and largest of the Neolithic cemeteries in Europe which dates back as far as 3200 BC. Between Slieve League and the shoreline in Sligo is where you will find Inishmurry which was home to the early Celtic Christian monks. Moving further along the coast in County Mayo is the little port of Killala which is the location of the French landing in 1798. The French came to help the United Irish men in their rebellion against the British crown at the time. Unfortunately, the French were unable to succeed, and they made peace and sailed back to France.

A little closer to home at Carrigan Head, you can see one of the Signal Towers which was built by the British to watch out for the return of the French. At the top of Slieve League is where you can find one of the early Christian monastic sites where the remains of Ade McBric's chapel can still be seen. Alongside the chapel there are also remains of the monks stone dwellings or 'beehive huts' as they are known.

A walk across 'One Man's Path' is where you will find a trig point which is placed atop an ancient structure which is of unknown origin. Slieve League is known as a sacred mountain which held Christian Pilgrimages for over a thousand years. It is important to remember this fact whilst visiting Slieve League as to not disturb these monuments of Irish cultural heritage.



he three-year plan, which runs from 2024 to 2026, is a 37% increase on the previous Capital Programme and is four times larger than the programme that was adopted in 2017.

A total of 312 projects are covered under the new Capital Programme of which 67, representing a spend of €215m, are already on site. The remainder are in the concept to project approval cycle. This time last year there were 37 Capital Programme projects worth €117m on site.

These include major projects such as the €150m mixed tenure development at Ballymastone, the €116m mixed tenure development at Church Fields in Mulhuddart, the €44m Swords Cultural Centre, the €16m Ongar to Barnhill Road and the €7.7m pedestrian and cycle route on the Harry Reynolds Road in Balbriggan.

The Mayor of Fingal, Cllr Adrian Henchy, said: "This is the fifth Capital Programme that has been brought before this Council since the last local elections in 2019 and every year we have seen the number and value of projects grow. However, the most pleasing thing is that we have also seen delivery and there has been a tremendous improvement in strategic infrastructure across the county including new housing, new community facilities and new transport links as well the preservation of our heritage. The majority of our funding for these projects has come from Central Government and it is certainly helping us to grow our county in a sustainable way."

Just over €1bn of the funding for the Capital Programme will come from grants with development levies providing a further €120m and €59m being sourced from Fingal's revenue budget. An additional €66m will be generated through loans and other sources. Another €99m worth of projects in the three-year plan are under assessment for possible funding sources.

Housing projects account for 63% of the Capital Programme at €859m while another €177m will be spent on Planning and Strategic Infrastructure projects like the Broadmeadow Greenway, the Snugborough Road Interchange, the Ward River Park, and Recreational Hubs in Donabate, Lusk and Rush.

The reinstatement and enhancement of regional roads across the county forms part of €48m Operations capital works programme that also includes infrastructural works to bridges and harbours, new playgrounds, and the public toilets refurbishment

programme. A further €32m has been set aside for Community facilities which includes the completion of the new Community Centre in Meakstown.

The Environment, Climate Action and Active Travel Department will have a budget of €77m for projects such as the provision of protected cycle lanes and safe routes to schools, Electric Vehicle Charging infrastructure, climate mitigation measures and landfill projects.

The programme for the Economic Enterprise Tourism and Cultural Development Department totals €139m and includes €37m for industrial development, €18m for heritage properties and €7m for the refurbishment of libraries. There is also a €30m provision for urban and rural regeneration of which €20m is earmarked for projects that are part of the Our Balbriggan regeneration plan.

The Programme projects a capital spend in 2024 of €386m, followed by €522m in 2025 and a further €447m in 2026.

Fingal County Council Chief Executive AnnMarie Farrelly said: "There is already a considerable amount of work underway with 67 projects already on site which is almost double what was onsite this time last year. We also have strong commitments in place to deliver many of the other projects in the Capital Programme and I look forward to progressing those over the next three years. There are other projects which councillors have asked us to look at, such as swimming pools, which are not yet ready for inclusion in the Capital Plan because we are carrying out audits to assess demand and potential cost. The programme reflects our determination to ensure that, as our population continues to grow, we are also developing the infrastructure required to build sustainable communities."

The Capital Programme is a rolling plan which is revised annually as time and other constraints may vary the progress of projects within a given period. The decision of councillors to agree the Capital Programme 2024-2026 does not confer approval on any individual project. This can only be done through the normal statutory processes and compliance with the Public Spending Code. Funding arrangements also need to be clearly identified and secured in advance of committing to any project.



Why we see more spiders and insects inside our homes in autumn

The tell-tale signs that autumn is here are clear to us; the days are getting shorter, and the temperature is decreasing.



e take this as a sign to pull out our winter woollies and think about turning on the radiators. But how do insects know that winter is coming? And what do they do to prepare?

Folklore has suggested over the years that insects and other invertebrates can predict the weather and that, for example, we could start to see bigger spider webs if the weather is going to get colder. The evidence for those bigger webs ahead of bad weather is weak. But there certainly are changes in insect behaviour we can see at this time of year, and it shows they are predicting changes they need to make as the weather changes.

Insects are extremely sensitive to changes in the environment and change in light is the main cue that insects use to signal the change in seasons. Insects, like humans, detect light with their eyes. But unlike humans insects have more than two eyes. In addition to the two big compound eyes that they have on the front of their heads most insects also have three smaller eyes on the top of their heads called ocelli. Light information is passed from their eyes to the brain and interpreted by an internal clock to detect the changing seasons, which may also be important in humans and other primates.

Responding to the changing seasons is really important for insects as they are cold blooded and can't regulate their own body temperature. But insects have different ways of coping with the oncoming cold weather. Some, like the painted lady butterfly, leave the UK in autumn heading to north Africa where they breed. Others produce their own "antifreeze" proteins that allow them to cope with winter temperatures. However, the majority of insects undergo a slowing down process called diapause,

where they essentially sleep for the winter.

At this time of year, these insects, and other arthropods like spiders, are looking for a sheltered place to spend the winter and this is why we see more spiders in our houses at this time of year. You may also notice groups of insects, like ladybirds, huddled on windowsills and under rocks. These insects will stay protected over the winter and reawaken in spring.

Because of migration, diapause and the natural death of some insects at the end of the summer, you may generally feel there are fewer insects around than just a few weeks ago. But there are some new ones emerging that we didn't see earlier in the summer. In the south you might spot the beautiful ivy bee which is only active when the ivy is in blossom. Autumn also brings the mass emergence of crane flies, which, although they look a bit like mosquitos, are actually harmless.

You also might notice more wasps visiting flowers to drink the sugary nectar - at this time of year they become very hungry for sugar. Wasps don't really care where they get their sugar fix from and are just as likely to try and steal our sugary drinks as we are enjoying the last of the summer in our gardens or enjoying a walk. Their craving for sugar is actually really beneficial as their visits flower-to-flower, trying to satisfy their insatiable craving, lead them to pollinate flowers just like bees.

For me the most striking sign of autumn is the appearance of a lot of very large bumblebees out visiting the last flowers of the season. These large bees are next year's queens. After being born late in the summer season they mate and stock up on energy before finding a place to hibernate for the winter. When we see them again it'll be an indicator that spring is on its way when the queens emerge from their sleep and make new nests.





ISPCC welcomes Budget proposals for improved mental health services for children and young people but notes there's more to be done

ISPCC welcomes Minister Mary Butler's Budget 2024 announcements for children and young people's mental health, in particular the creation of a new central referral mechanism.



his will allow the HSE to triage referrals to the right service ensuring what the Minister refers to as a 'no wrong door' approach. We know first-hand of the frustrations of children and families when they are trying to access appropriate support and end up being moved around from waiting list to waiting list.

The allocation of funding for a new mental health app is positive and ought to help with signposting users to the services and supports that are available.

We also welcome the Minister's comments on the important role NGOs, such as ISPCC, play in the delivery of mental-health support services in the community. As an organisation dedicated to supporting children and young people, ISPCC recognises the need for systemic change in how we, as a society, address mental-health concerns. Therefore, it is heartening to hear that a new head has been appointed to lead the work on reforming child and youth mental health.

The Budget 2024 investment is a welcome successor to that contained in Budget 2023. Then, funding was allocated for the first ever Clinical Lead for Youth Mental Health and the establishment of a dedicated National Office for Child and Youth Mental Health. These are both key steps in providing leadership and oversight in this area.

ISPCC Head of Policy and Public Affairs Fiona Jennings says that "we recognise the systemic challenges our mental-health sector faces and believe these can only be overcome by a concerted effort among all stakeholders. The announcement of a triage service to help direct children and young people to appropriate services is hugely welcome and will go some way to alleviating waiting lists.

"However, mental health funding remains a long way off from the 10% target of overall health spending by 2025."

The combination of the proposed triage system, the establishment of the child poverty and wellbeing unit in the Department of An Taoiseach and that mental health may be a spotlight issue in the next national policy framework for children and young people mean that these initiatives ought to go some way to realising the pathfinder way of working and we welcome this

Children with complex needs are a group of children who will require a particular focus and all efforts must be employed to ensure they do not slip through the cracks.

There has never been a more important time than now to prioritise the mental health of young people, as families face financial uncertainty, young people tackle new levels of social media pressure and they are exposed to the reality of wars and the aftermath of a global pandemic.


