LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICE KILDARE CLIENTS CREATED OVER 284 JOBS IN 2022

Local enterprise office Kildare now supporting over 256 small businesses and 1,297 jobs according to new figures.

oday, Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment Simon Coveney TD, announced the annual results of the Local Enterprise Offices (LEOs) for 2022 which showed that Local Enterprise Office supported companies created 284 jobs in 2022.

The net jobs created by Local Enterprise Office Kildare supported clients in 2022 was 148 which takes into account companies that amalgamated, ceased trading and those that transferred on to Enterprise Ireland.

The new figures show that the LEO Kildare financially supported 256 small businesses in their portfolio across the county and these companies in turn employ 1,297 people.

The total national figures for the Local Enterprise Offices across the country were announced with the LEOs now supporting 37,863 jobs across 7,221 companies. In 2022 there were 7,870 new jobs created by LEO client's companies with a net jobs creation figure of 3,447. This was up 10% nationally on 2021. From the jobs created, 84% were outside of the Dublin region.

The LEOs also provide substantial funded supports to thousands of other small businesses across the country with programmes such as the Trading Online Voucher, Lean for Micro and Green for Micro along with training and mentoring. Simon Coveney, T.D., Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment, said; "These results show the significant role the Local Enterprise Offices are playing in not only creating new businesses and jobs but also in sustaining them. On the back of some of the most difficult years for small businesses we are still seeing growth across the country. During the pandemic we saw how essential the LEOs were to small businesses, and they will be essential as we navigate the ongoing cost of living and energy crises.

"With 84% of new jobs being created outside of Dublin it reinforces the Government's strategy to strengthen employment throughout Ireland. As the remit of the Local Enterprise Offices has now broadened to companies up to fifty employees, even more SMEs will be able to avail of their supports, but also their expertise in growing enterprise in towns and villages across the country."

Kildare County Council's Chief Executive, Sonya Kavanagh, added: "The Local Enterprise Offices across the country have gone above and beyond in their support of small businesses, and Kildare is no different. We are seeing new opportunities for Irish businesses here and even with tough economic periods we see new ideas and companies emerge and flourish. We are proactive in building a vibrant infrastructure for entrepreneurs in our county and it is important to recognise all that they have achieved."

oderic O'Gorman, Minister for Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth today welcomed the introduction of new subsidy rates under the National Childcare Scheme, which is set to substantially reduce out of pocket costs for early

learning and childcare for thousands of families across the country.

From 2 January, the minimum hourly subsidy under the National Childcare Scheme for all children under 15 will be \in 1.40 – an increase of \in 0.90 per hour from last year.

For families using Tusla-registered early learning and childcare, this subsidy increase represents further cost reductions of \in 2,106 (or a reduction of \in 3,326 in total) off the annual cost of early learning and childcare for each child.

The change to the National Childcare Scheme is being backed by €121 million secured in Budget 2023 by Minister O'Gorman, bringing total funding for the Scheme to €358 million this year.

Record numbers of children are now accessing supports under



the Scheme. More than 98,000 children are currently in receipt of support, representing an 82% increase in the number of children for the same period last year.

Welcoming today's changes to the National Childcare Scheme, the Minister said:

"This Government is delivering on its promise to make highquality early learning and childcare more affordable for families and accessible to all children.

Families can now benefit from significant increases in the National Childcare Scheme, helping to ease the financial pressure associated with early learning and childcare in Ireland.

Increasing the subsidy that families can avail of under the National Childcare Scheme is the best way to ensure all families with children in Tusla-registered early learning and childcare can benefit from the Government's €1 billion investment in early learning and childcare for 2023.

More families than ever before are already availing of the National Childcare Scheme, offsetting their early learning and childcare costs, and I am confident that with this additional investment starting today, we can bring further benefits to these families and thousands more like them.

Garda Inspectorate Iaunches its Domestic Abuse Victim Survey

The Garda Inspectorate has today launched an on-line survey to gauge how victims of domestic abuse are dealt with by the Garda Síochána.

his survey is part of an on-going inspection into the effectiveness and efficiency of the Garda Síochána's response to domestic abuse. Deputy Chief Inspector Pauline Shields, who is leading this inspection said,

"Hearing from victims and survivors of domestic



abuse is an important part of our inspection. I would encourage anyone who has been a victim of domestic abuse to take this opportunity to tell us about their experience with the Garda Síochána. She continued, "I want to assure people that the survey is completely anonymous and any information supplied to the Garda Inspectorate will be treated in the strictest confidence."

The Inspectorate will refer to the results of the survey in a published report relating to this inspection.

This inspection is examining the Garda Síochána's approach to tackling domestic abuse at both strategic and operational levels, with reference to the best standards of comparable police services.

The survey will run for a period of four weeks from Monday 9 January 2023.

Retrofitting your home

If this falls short, several insulation measures are available – wall insulation, roof insulation, floor insulation, window, and door upgrades.

Airtightness

Insulation will seal the house from a thermal point of view, but unwanted draughts can undo much of the hard work and expense of this insulation upgrade. A leaky house, particularly in the winter months, means cold spots and higher bills. An airtightness test will confirm if the retrofit is meeting required standards.



Ventilation

A well-ventilated home is a healthy home. The purpose of sealing a draughty house is not to stop the exchange of fresh air but rather to control it. There are two distinct options – demand-controlled ventilation and mechanical heat recovery – and the choice of which to install depends on the home and budget. Both systems provide fresh air and moisture control to kitchens and bathrooms, as well as neutralising many unwanted odours.

What does it cost?

Promised Rail Service Improvements Must Be Delivered On Time

Sinn Féin Councillor for Lucan-Palmerstown-North Clondalkin, Derren Ó Brádaigh, has called for greater focus and urgency to address the growing need to meet rail commuter requirements in tandem with population increases and continued housing expansion in West Lucan. The Councillor has continued to bring this concern to National Transport Authority management and was commenting to a recent response received regarding specific questions poised.

IIr Ó Brádaigh said; "The feedback that I am receiving on the ground from residents and existing commuters is one of concern. Lucan commuters are increasingly worried about the delivery of much needed improvements to the local services and indeed the wider railway network into the future. Entire swathes of estates extending from Griffeen and South-East Lucan, all the way through to the newer developments in West Lucan such as Shackleton, Gandon, St Helen's and

Adamstown are already in need of a good reliable train service.

"Recently, I asked for clarity regarding larnróid Éireann's plans both in the short and longer term to increase carriage numbers for services stopping at Adamstown, Fonthill and Parkwest stations. In their response, larnród Éireann reiterated to me, that they are taking delivery of 41 new Intercity Railcars (ICR's). These are expected to enter service throughout 2023. As they are intermediate carriages, they will facilitate the lengthening of existing trains. While at the time



of order their primary usage was envisaged to be on commuter lines, the company is reviewing proposed deployment with the NTA in the context of emerging post-Covid travel patterns, and larnród Éireann's Strategy 2027 which targets service frequency improvements on several routes. Decisions on this will be made over the coming months, based on evaluation of demand across the network.

"In 2024, delivery of 95 DART+ carriages are expected, and I am informed that a further 90 carriages are scheduled for 2026. These carriages will be used across the Greater Dublin Area to allow for increased service frequency and capacity. The first 95 will be used on the Northern Commuter Lines, hopefully freeing up Intercity Railcar and Commuter Carriages for usage elsewhere on the network, and the subsequent 90 carriages will directly benefit the Heuston commuter lines, through Clondalkin and Lucan along the Kildare railway line. It is essential that these deliveries and timelines are now met, but also kept under constant review as Lucan continues to grow, with the transition in transport choices away

from the motor car being actively promoted.

Regarding the long-delayed opening of the Kishogue train station, Cllr Ó Brádaigh was also commenting;

"Having sought yet further updates as to the opening of the Kishogue train station, I was informed that larnród Éireann intend to start work to bring Kishogue station into service towards the end of this year and being fully operational. There are extensive works needed to bring the station into service, including meeting present day accessibility and system requirements. Unfortunately, as we know, the station has remained idle for 14 years with the original cost of construction €6.35m and every week people continue to ask me the same question "When is Kishogue opening?" Both my colleagues and I have and will continue to press upon the importance of the delivery of a first-class transport system, that addresses the everyday needs of local workers and all the inhabitants of the general travelling community."

Why your cat might be a better weather forecaster than Met Éireann

Irish people certainly talk about the weather a lot. This is not surprising as we have such a changeable climate; it has been often said that in Ireland one can experience the four seasons in one day.

hilst we talk about it, how good are we at predicting it?

There is a lot of folklore about predicting weather and it turns out, some of it is true or partly true. Here are some examples of weather folklore and why animals know more than we do.

A year of snow, crops will grow.

Fact: A several-inch layer of snow contains more air than ice. Trapped between the interlocking snowflakes, the air serves to insulate the plants beneath it. When the snow melts, the water helps to keep the ground moist.

If there is thunder in winter, it will snow 7 days later.

Partly True: According to a meteorologist in Washington, D.C., this is true about 70 percent of the time, especially from the East Coast to the Plains. Thunder in winter is an anomaly often caused by a big dip and a big rise in the jet stream. When the next weather system arrives several—if not exactly 7—days later, temperatures may still be cold enough to cause the moisture in the system to fall as snow.

A ring around the Moon means rain will come real soon.

True: A ring, or halo, around the Moon is caused when the light of the Moon refracts through ice crystals present in high-level clouds. Although these clouds do not produce precipitation, they often occur in advance of an approaching low-pressure system,

which often brings precipitation in the form of rain or snow. Here are a few clues to making your own predictions:

Pay attention to winds and clouds.

These are the big predictors of changes in barometric pressure and resulting weather. For instance, the adage "No weather is ill, if the wind be still" indicates a high-pressure system, a broad area of descending air characterized by calm winds and little cloud formation.

Observe sheep, cats, and cows.

Their bodies are affected by changes in air pressure. When rain is on the way, old sheep turn their backs to the wind, cats sneeze, and cows lie down. They become restless when stormy weather approaches and may lie down in a dry spot. (Of course, cows also lie down for several other reasons!) Also, Animals graze with their tail toward the wind so that if a predator sneaks up behind them, the wind will help catch the scent of the predator and prevent an attack.

When Cats Sneeze, Rain's on Its Way

We all know that our feline friends seem to have extra-sensory abilities (at least, the cats think so). But is there any truth to this? A book commissioned by the American War Department, "Weather Proverbs," in 1883 stated that cats had many ways to predict weather.

Sheep

One proverb states, "When sheep turn into the wind, expect rain."



Another says, "If sheep ascend hills and scatter, expect clear weather."

Conversely, if sheep huddle up in a tight group, expect rain or snow. Frankly, if you had warm and woolly friends, wouldn't you huddle up, too?

Watch birds in flight.

Air pressure affects many birds. For example, swallows have sensitive ears; when the barometric pressure drops, they fly as close to the ground as possible, where air density is greatest. Generally, low-flying birds are signs of rain; highflyers indicate fair weather.

• If the bull leads the cows to pasture, expect rain; if the cows precede the bull, the weather will be uncertain.

• When hungry bites the thirsty flea, rain and clouds you sure :

• When horses and cattle stretch out their necks and sniff the air, it will rain.

NEW INTERNATIONAL SURROGACY LAWS WILL GIVE FAMILIES LEGAL CERTAINTY IN IRELAND

Parents of babies born through surrogacy will finally have their right to parentage enshrined in Irish law, Dublin Mid West's Fine Gael TD has said..

eputy Emer Higgins welcomed yesterday's agreement at Cabinet for legislative amendments to be brought to the committee stage of the Assisted Human Reproduction Bill to legislate for international surrogacy.

Deputy Higgins said: "It was an honour to serve as the vice-chair on the Oireachtas Committee on International Surrogacy as we came together to examine the difficulties and challenges that parents through surrogacy face and how we can best protect and acknowledge them and their children.

"The amendments agreed yesterday will make sure that parents who went through surrogacy and who are not currently legally recognised by the State will be able to apply for parental orders so that they can make decisions for their children.

"I know this will be really welcome news for the many parents and advocates we met and engaged with as a committee," said Deputy Higgins.

"Currently parents in this situation can't make decisions for their children on things like school trips, medical care,

medication, or having their photos taken.

"And in situations where a relationship may break down second parents have been at the mercy of the child's biological father as to whether get access or custody of their children which can lead to extremely nasty and stressful negotiations for some mothers.

"But now, parents in this situation will be able to go through the court to secure access and custody of their children.

Deputy Higgins continued: I've met a number of local families in Dublin Mid West who have been impacted by our old-fashioned laws but now Ireland will have a very high ethical legislative framework to provide protections for families and surrogates when Irish children are born via surrogacy abroad.

"And I have to commend my colleagues in Fine Gael, especially Senator Mary Seery Kearney for her continued hard work in this area to get us to where we are now.

"I hope now that these legislative amendments will move quickly through Oireachtas and we will see the first applications to the Courts being made next year," concluded Deputy Higgins.



Argos to close all Ireland **Stores**

Argos will shut all of its stores in the Republic of Ireland in June this year, the company said on Thursday, following a "period of careful consideration". This includes Argos stores in Blanchardstown and Liffey valley.

> he move is expected to result in 580 employees losing their jobs and the closure of 34 sites across the country.

The company, which sells electronics, gadgets, and toys, said it would propose an enhanced redundancy package for the affected workers during negotiations with Mandate, the trade union that represents retail workers in Ireland.

Argos said the package would go "well beyond its statutory obligations".

Following a review, the company said it had concluded that the "investment required to develop and modernise the Irish part of its business was not viable and that the money would be better invested in other parts of its business".

The company operates in the Republic of Ireland with a "significantly different" business model to England, : will continue to apply until Argos stores close.



Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, according to Argos, meaning the closures would not affect any of the company's other branches.

Andy McClelland, Argos Ireland Operations Manage, said: "We understand this is difficult news for our customers and colleagues.

"As with any major change to our business, we have not made this decision lightly and we are doing everything we can to support those impacted."

Argos stores will remain open to customers in the Republic of Ireland until 24 June 2023.

Before that date, the company will begin winding down its operations - it will stop taking orders from customers via the Argos website or its home delivery service after 22 March 2023.

Kildare County Council are to progress Celbridge to Hazelhatch Link Road



Kildare County Council has successfully completed Phase 2 of the Celbridge to Hazelhatch Link Road project - Options Selection - and can confirm that, through funding from the Department of Housing Planning and Local Government (DoHPLG) under the Urban Regeneration Development Fund (URDF), that they will now progress to Phase 3 Design and Environmental Evaluation.

o date, the project has completed the concept and feasibility stage and more recently the selection of options. The Option Selection Report for the Celbridge to Hazelhatch Link Road scheme has now been published and all documentation is available to view on the project portal website below:

https://consult.kildarecoco.ie/en/consultation/celbridgehazelhatch-link-road-final-preferred-route-corridor-option

Hard copies of the documentation are available to view at Kildare County Council offices, Áras Chill Dara, Devoy Park, Naas, Co. Kildare W91 X77F by appointment only from December 15th, 2022 – February 9th 2023.

Celbridge is an important regional town within Kildare and a significant commuter town for Dublin and other employment centres in the region. Celbridge has seen its population more than double in the past 30 years with over 70% of the population living north of the River Liffey.

Traffic demands in Celbridge are likely to grow significantly in the coming decade with lands south of the town centre earmarked for development with the existing

road network in and around Celbridge town centre, including the existing bridge over the River Liffey, already experiencing daily traffic congestion.

The new Celbridge to Hazelhatch Link Road (CHLR) Scheme will benefit all road users and deliver local improvements through:

- Improving connectivity to Hazelhatch Train Station
- · Improved safety for pedestrians and cyclists
- · Facilitate development of zoned lands

• Result in shorter, safer, and more sustainable journeys to Hazelhatch Train Station

The project will now move to the next phase - Design and Environmental Evaluation - which includes the preliminary design of the road alignment. An initial design is currently being progressed, which will allow the Project Team to start meaningful discussions with affected landowners in Q2 2023.

In addition, ground investigation works, and various environmental and other surveys will be required as part of this phase which will inform the design the alignment and proposing mitigation measures.

Vital E-Scooter Legislation is passed ahead of roll out of Electric Charging Strategy

NCBI, Irish Guide Dogs for the Blind and Irish Wheelchair Association are urging Minister for Transport Eamon Ryan to take action with e-scooter legislation in order to protect pedestrians with access needs before it is too late.



he Minister recently unveiled his strategy for electric charging vehicle infrastructure which will include the development of new mobility hubs in cities, where people can charge electric cars, bikes and scooters and avail of shared-use electric vehicles. However, despite their increased usage there is still no clear legislation or a regulatory framework around the use of e-scooters. The three organisations are calling on the Minister to bring forward latestage amendments to ban the use of e-scooters on footpaths, mandate designated parking bays, reduce the maximum speed limit, and to ensure age restrictions and insurance requirements apply.

Recent research conducted by Dublin City Council demonstrates that 73% of respondents identified "Danger to other road users" as a negative aspect of e-scooters and 59% indicated a preference for designated parking for e-scooters.

Lorna Fitzpatrick, Advocacy and Engagement Manager said; "Having the infrastructure to support this use of electric vehicles is vital but the legislation and regulations around use of e-scooters is essential to protect the safety of pedestrians with access needs. We know from our own research that 77% of respondents have already reported they had an incident with an e-scooter on a footpath. The Bill bans the use of e-scooters on motorways and busways yet not on footpaths that people with access needs rely on for independent travel. There is clear evidence from at home and abroad that e-scooters have caused harm to people when involved in accidents, yet the Minister has not moved to mitigate against these risks within the legislation."

Irish Guide Dogs for the Blind Advocacy Manager, Léan Kennedy, said; "Blind and vision impaired people have no way of pre-empting a collision with an e-scooter in their travel space. Often, encroaching e-scooters can startle a guide dog forcing

it to stop and thereby disorientating its owner. We know that 90% of our clients are concerned for their safety in relation to e-scooters, with 53% having had a negative experience or near collision with an e-scooter. It should be easy to understand the need to prohibit e-scooter use on footpaths and in pedestrianised shared use areas. Despite Ireland having ratified the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, the needs of Guide Dog and Assistance Dog owners are being neglected by the Minister in the development of this bill and it would take minimal effort for the recommendations in our position paper to be incorporated into the primary legislation. We strongly encourage the Minister to meet with us before the confidence and freedom that people with mobility and vision impairments currently enjoy comes to significant harm."

John Fulham, Irish Wheelchair Association Public Engagement Manager said; "The concerns and lived experience of people with disabilities and limited mobility in relation to the use of e-scooters has been clearly communicated by us to the Minister. Regrettably, this has not been deemed important enough by the Minister and his department to be adequately addressed within the proposed legislation. The safety and security of those with disabilities and limited mobility is being compromised. Should the legislation remain in its current form, it places those with disabilities and limited mobility in a very vulnerable position. We urge Minister Ryan to reconsider his approach and address the issues previously raised in the legislation."

All three organisations have again expressed their concerns that the Minister has not been available to meet with them to hear directly about the issues this legislation will have for people with access needs across the country and again reiterate their openness and availability to meet with the Minister at his earliest opportunity.

Centenary of the opening of **King Tut's tomb**

February 16th this year, marks the centennial of the opening of the inner chamber of the Tomb of Tutankhamun in Eqypt, which had lain undisturbed for more than three thousand years, until one hundred years ago. Local writer Claire Keogh reports briefly on the historical significance of the find.

utankhamun reigned as pharaoh between c. 1334 and 1325 BC, towards the end of the Eighteenth Dynasty during the New Kingdom. He took the throne as a child after the death of Akhenaten (who was his father); and the subsequent brief reigns of Neferneferuaten and Smenkhkare. Akhenaten had radically reshaped ancient Egyptian religion by worshipping a single deity, Aten, and rejecting other deities, a shift that began the Amarna Period. One of Tutankhamun's major acts was the restoration of traditional religious practice. His name was changed - from Tutankhaten, referring to Akhenaten's deity - to Tutankhamun, honouring Amun, one of the foremost deities of the traditional pantheon. Similarly, his queen's name was changed from Ankhesenpaaten to Ankhesenamun. His name was often shortened to Kit Tut.

Shortly after Tutenkhamun took power, he commissioned a full-size royal tomb, which was one of two tombs from the same era, WV23 or KV57. The tomb is thought to have originally been a non-royal tomb, intended for Ay, Tutankhamun's advisor. After he died prematurely, KV62 was enlarged to accommodate his burial. Ay became i a quick restoration, it was sealed off again.

pharaoh on Tutankhamun's death and was buried in WV23. Ay was elderly when he came to the throne, and it is possible that he buried Tutankhamun in KV62 to usurp WV23 for himself and ensure that he would have a tomb of suitably royal proportions ready when he himself died.

After Ay's death, Tutankhamun's general, Horemheb, came to power, although it may have been a contested transition and caused a brief period of unrest. Following the trend of rejecting Atenism, Horemheb attempted to strip away Akhenaten's existence and take credit for the monuments that Tutankhamun had built. Future king-lists moved on from Akhenaten's father, Amenhotep III, to Horemheb with no mention of Akhenaten.

Not long after being buried, the tomb was robbed twice. After the first instance of theft, the officials in charge of it rescued and repacked some of the items that had been damaged and filled the hallway with chunks of limestone and objects left by the robbers to ward off any future break-ins. However, a second set of looters managed to tunnel through the debris. This was discovered, and after







The Valley of the Kings is often hit with sudden flash floods that bring with them alluvium. The entrance to Tutankhamun's tomb was obscured by the layer of sediment that had come in with the torrential rains. Stephen Cross has theorized that this flood had occurred after KV62 was closed and before huts were built for the tomb diggers, meaning that Tutankhamun's resting place would have been inaccessible by the time of Ay's rule. On the other hand, Andreas Dorn has suggested that this layer was around during Tutankhamun's reign, which would mean that laborers had to burrow through it to reach the bedrock where they carved his burial chamber.

More than a century and a half after King Tutankhamun's burial, KV9, the tomb of Ramesses V and Ramesses VI, was cut into the same amount of rock situated west of Tutankhamun's tomb. The opening of his tomb was masked by mounds of debris from the digging of KV9 and huts constructed by the graveyard laborers.

In the next few years, thievery ran rampant in the valley first by groupings of local thieves during the late Twentieth Dynasty, then by representatives or members of the High Priests of Amun during the Twenty-first Dynasty who plundered the tombs' prized possessions and stole away the royal mummies.

The tomb of Tutenkhamun lay deep in the chamber, all but hidden by sand and rock, swallowed by the earth. It had gone undiscovered. Twenty-one centuries after being sealed and buried, Tutankhamun's mummy was still in perfect condition, when it was opened, although the burial goods were not. Many people assume that the sheer number of items found in Tutankhamun's tomb is an indication that other, longer-lived rulers were buried with an even greater number of possessions. However, Joyce Tyldesley, an Egyptologist, points out that Tutankhamun's burial goods barely fit into his crypt; she argues that the tombs of other, larger kings in the valley contained similar collections of items, but arranged much more neatly and elegantly.

The statuette of Tutankhamun standing on a panther is a duplicate of images from the tomb of Seti II. Burial objects found in tombs in the Valley of the Kings indicate that there was a common set of objects given to royals in this period. Many of the statues and statuettes of deities in Tutankhamun's tomb are like those found in other tombs in the area, while his own statuettes are like wall paintings in KV15, Seti II's tomb.

A bronze statuette of Tutankhamun on a panther, located in his tomb, is very similar to images found in the tomb of Seti II. Objects like these were a norm in the tombs of royalty during this period. Numerous statues and statuettes found in Tutankhamun's tomb are similar to other tombs in the Valley of the Kings, while his own statuettes are very much like the paintings in KV15.

Funerary models were not usually seen in non-royal tombs during the New Kingdom. However, many royal tombs still had them. But Tutankhamun's tomb deviated from the norm by not having funerary texts on papyri. Yet there was an excerpt from the Book of the Dead on a papyrus from KV35, found in Amenhotep II's tomb, which suggests that their absence may have been considered strange.
