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Subaru Solterra AWD is an EV Shining Star - Declan Glynn



Subaru began life as the Nakajima Aircraft Company in 1917 and, over its lifespan, the worldfamous Japanese conglomerate has constructed a prestigious reputation of being a catalyst of engineering excellence. The brand has made it's stamp worldwide in motorsport, aircraft manufacturing and most importantly – automotive.

Technologically Advanced.

Subaru launched itself into the new age of electrification with the introduction of the all-new Forester e-BOXER Hybrid and XV e-BOXER Hybrid – which arrived in Ireland in 2019. Now, Subaru has gone one step further with the launch of the all-new, fully-electric Solterra, which is the most technologically advanced Subaru ever made. Built on Subaru's first ever all-electric architecture – the Subaru e-Global Platform – the Solterra got its name by combining the Latin words for 'sun' and 'earth'. With Subaru's core technology, dual motors and its trusted Permanent All-Wheel Drive (AWD) System, it promises an outstanding driving performance, with the same 5-star safety, goanywhere capability and rugged reliability that Subaru SUVs are renowned for.

Proper Off-Road Ability.

The Solterra is Subaru's version of the Toyota bZ4X, with the main difference being that the Solterra comes with four-wheel drive as standard. Subaru and Toyota have developed cars together before, with the Toyota GR 86 and the Subaru BRZ being just one joint development from the recent past. Toyota now owns 20% of Fuji Heavy Industries, which is the parent company of Subaru, and both companies believe this increased stake (up from 16% prior to 2020) will help them build better vehicles for their customers. Subaru stayed true to its roots as a maker of

capable off-road vehicles by giving its first electric SUV proper off-road ability, with an X Mode setting for extra traction when driving on tough terrain. The X Mode controls the motors and brakes to maximise traction on deep mud, snow or even steep, slippery slopes. With an impressive 210mm of ground clearance, a wade depth of 500mm, and approach and departure angles of 17.7 and 21.0 degrees respectively, the Solterra can be taken off the beaten track with confidence. Permanent AWD comes as standard and provides maximum confidence and control at all times by continuously shifting power to the wheels that have the most traction, ensuring excellent road-holding, irrespective of the weather or terrain.

Limited & Touring Trim Variants.

The new Solterra AWD SUV is available in Limited and Touring trim variants, both of which are powered by dual electric motors that produce 218PS (215bhp) and 336Nm of instant torque. This strong combination of power and torque provides the car with the ability to sprint from 0-100km/h in just 6.9-seconds. In terms of advanced safety features, the Solterra comes as standard with Subaru's Safety Sense Package in addition to an E-Call function and a Driver Monitoring System for total peace of mind on every journey. Drive modes consist of Eco, Normal and Power settings, along with X-Mode and Hill Descent Control functions. In terms of standard equipment, both variants come with a 12.3-inch infotainment system with sat-nav, along with heated front & rear seats, a 360-degree camera system, an electric tailgate, rear privacy glass, keyless entry, powerfolding door mirrors, dual-zone air-conditioning, wireless Apple CarPlay, wired Android Auto, and hugely-practical LED headlights with Adaptive Driving Beam (allowing full beam in all conditions). Upgrading to Touring trim brings with it larger alloy wheels (20-inch, as opposed to 18-inch in Limited trim), fixed panoramic roof, electric driver's seat with memory function, electric front passenger seat, followme-home lighting, wireless phone charging, and a Harmon Kardon audio system with 8 speakers.


Car on Review.

My review car was a Solterra Touring AWD in everpopular grey metallic paint, and it looked spectacular and ultra-modern from every angle. The Solterra has more than enough power on tap to dive into gaps in traffic, or join a motorway with confidence, while the extra traction that the four-wheel drive system provides is a terrific bonus when accelerating in slippery conditions too. The level of regenerative braking can be selected via the paddles behind the multi-function, leather-wrapped steering wheel, so it is very easy to select a level that suits an individual's driving style. With accurate steering, minimal amounts of body lean through fast bends, impressive grip, and a reassuringly-strong brake pedal feel, the Solterra is a joy to drive on any terrain. A well-judged suspension set-up provides the car with a compliant ride quality over rutted road surfaces and speed ramps, and the elevated driving position provides a commanding forward view. Overall fit and finish throughout the spacious cabin is commendable, and the comfortable and supportive seats come with fabric covering in Limited trim and with synthetic leather in Touring trim. The Solterra's practical boot has a capacity of up to 452 litres behind the rear seats (with a reclining function), but the 60/40 split folding seatbacks can be folded when the need arises, while the storage area under the boot floor is the ideal place to keep the charging cables. When the 71.4kWh battery is fully charged, the Solterra can achieve a range of up to 465km on a WLTP combined driving cycle. The charging socket is conveniently located on the passenger-side front wing, and it offers a variety of charging options, both at home and on the go. When connected to a public DC fast charging station, the lithiumion battery can complete a 20-80% charge in as little as 30 minutes.

Conclusion & Pricing.

Subaru's first all-electric car is highly commendable, and is true to the brand's all-weather roots. The Solterra is a handsome and very worthwhile addition to Subaru's current model range, and it comes with a 3-year/100,000km vehicle warranty, along with an 8-year/160,000km electric battery warranty. The Solterra Limited AWD is priced at €44,995 and the Touring AWD is priced at €49,995 (inclusive of current Irish Government/SEAI incentives for private buyers).





Kildare County Council wish to give advance notice that traffic on the R403 over the River Liffey bridge in Celbridge will be reduced to a single lane from 9:30am on Tuesday 29th October until 5:00pm on Friday 1st November 2024 inclusive.

his is to facilitate emergency repair works, to ensure the safety and structural integrity of the bridge. The works will be carried out by Triur Construction Limited on behalf of Kildare County Council.

Traffic management will include local diversions for the following roads near the bridge: L1016 (Newtown Road) and R405 (Hazelhatch Road).

• Traffic travelling on the L1016 (Newtown Road) towards the bridge will be diverted through the L6057 (Simmonstown Manor) on to the Hazelhatch Road.

• Traffic traveling on the R405 (Hazelhatch Road) towards the bridge will be diverted through the L1027 (Shinkeen Road) onto the R403 Dublin Road.

• Vehicles exiting Saint Patrick's Park will only be able to exit via church road/Tea lane (L5065).

Alternative routes will be signposted. Kildare County Council would encourage motorists to use these route diversions, allow extra time for travel and minimise journeys over the bridge where possible.

All efforts will be made to ensure the smooth flow of traffic. Single lane traffic will be maintained over the bridge at all times, with

traffic lights operating on both sides, however long queuing and delays are unavoidable.



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Sausage, pumpkin and sage casserole

The cold nights are here. Warm yourself up on a Halloween night with this comforting dish. It's also a great way to use up any leftover pumpkin

Ingredients

- 50g/1¾oz butter
- 6 good-quality sausages, pricked several times with a fork
- 1 onion, peeled, thinly sliced
- 3 banana shallots, peeled, finely chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, peeled, finely chopped
- 1 tbsp chopped fresh sage
- 1 small pumpkin, peeled, seeds removed, cut into equal-sized pieces
- 1 tbsp white wine vinegar
- 1 tsp caster sugar
- 200g/7oz canned chopped tomatoes
- 400g/14oz canned cannellini beans, drained, rinsed
- 500ml/18fl oz chicken stock
- · salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh flatleaf parsley, to serve

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4.

2. Heat half the butter in a large casserole over a medium heat and fry the sausages for 4-5 minutes, or until golden-brown all over.


3.Add the remaining butter, onion and shallots and fry for three minutes, or until softened. Add the garlic and sage leaves and cook for a further three minutes, stirring well.

4. Add the pumpkin and stir the mixture until well combined. Increase the heat to high and add the white wine vinegar. Continue to cook until most of the liquid has evaporated.

5. Add the sugar, tomatoes, cannellini beans and stock and season, to taste, with salt and freshly ground black pepper.

6. Bring the mixture to the boil, then transfer the casserole to the oven for one hour, or until the sausages are cooked through and the pumpkin is tender.

7. To serve, ladle the casserole into two large bowl and sprinkle with the flatleaf parsley.





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Kildare County Council signs contract for delivery of new Fire Station in Maynooth



Kildare County Council has appointed M. L. Quinn Ltd as main contractor for the delivery of a new fire station at Maynooth in Co. Kildare, with the signing of contracts having taken place on Friday 6th Sept 2024.

he site for the new fire station is located at Mullin Park, Maynooth and has been designed by a multi-disciplined team led by Vincent Hannon and Associates Architects.

The €4.4m project is being funded by the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage, through the National Directorate for Fire & Emergency Management. A key component of the construction of the new 3-bay appliance facility will be the introduction of environmentally friendly features, including the installation of PV panels, air-to water heating systems, as well as insulation of doors, windows, roof, floor and walls to improve conservation of energy to current building regulations standards. The new design will also incorporate a training yard with drill tower, lecture room, canteen and staff facilities. The facilities will also include individual changing areas for each crew member.

Maynooth fire station was mobilised to 378 incidents in 2023, making it third busiest of the 6 fire stations in County Kildare.

Sonya Kavanagh, Chief Executive, Kildare County Council said; "We are delighted to reach this



stage in the development of a new Fire Station in Maynooth. This new station will allow Maynooth fire station to serve the community of Maynooth and its environs from a modern fit for purpose facility for many years to come. We look forward to working with the team from M. L Quinn Ltd to bring the project to completion."

Cathaoirleach of the County of Kildare, Cllr Joe Neville said; "I welcome this significant investment in the Fire Service, which will further support the team to deliver a vital service to the people of Maynooth and beyond. It is a key focus of mine that fast growing towns in Kildare with its massive population growth get the services and community infrastructure it requires.



Choosing the right wine glass can enhance your wine-drinking experience, as the shape and size of the glass can significantly impact the aroma, taste, and overall enjoyment of the wine.

• Sauvignon Blanc Glass: A slimmer, slightly tapered bowl that preserves the crisp, aromatic notes of wines like Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Grigio, and other light, fresh whites.

• Chardonnay Glass: A slightly larger bowl than the typical white wine glass, designed to enhance the fuller body and richer flavours of oaked wines like Chardonnay and Viognier.

Sparkling Wine Glasses

Sparkling wines like Champagne, Prosecco, and Cava require glasses that preserve their bubbles and delicate aromas.

• Flute: A tall, narrow glass that retains carbonation, allowing the bubbles to travel slowly to the top. This style enhances the visual appeal of the bubbles and concentrates the wine's subtle aromas.

· Tulip Glass: A slightly wider bowl with a narrowed

rim, allowing more room for the bubbles to develop while enhancing the wine's bouquet. It's a more modern choice for those who enjoy the aromas as much as the effervescence.

Rosé Wine Glasses

Rosé glasses are typically shaped with a shorter bowl and a slightly flared rim, enhancing the wine's fresh, fruity notes while directing it to the tip of the tongue.

Dessert Wine Glasses

Dessert wines are best served in smaller glasses that focus the rich, sweet aromas while controlling the pour size.

• Port Glass: A smaller glass with a narrower bowl that accentuates the wine's concentrated flavours and aromas.



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Kildare County Council awards contract for the M4/N4 westbound bus priority measures project

Kildare County Council in partnership with South Dublin County Council are delighted to announce the appointment of Arup as technical advisor on the M4/N4 westbound hard shoulder bus priority measures project.

he objective of this project is to deliver bus priority measures in the westbound direction of the M4/N4 between Maynooth and Leixlip/ Lucan. Arup have now been appointed to complete Phase 3, Design and Environmental Evaluation, and Phase 4, Statutory Process, on the project. This will take the project through the planning phase subject to planning approval.

The requirement for a westbound hard shoulder bus priority measure has been identified as part of the overall preferred option for the westbound carriageway in the Maynooth Leixlip Project. The M4/N4 westbound bus priority measures when combined with the M4 Eastbound Bus Priority Measures Pilot Project, represent the preferred option for the mainline portion, i.e. the M4 motorway portion of the Maynooth Leixlip Project. The M4 Eastbound bus priority measures are currently under construction with a temporary speed limit reduction order in place on the M4 eastbound carriageway from junction 5 to 6 until the 2nd of December 2024 in order to facilitate its delivery. Both bus priority measures are identified in the NTA Greater Dublin Area Transport Strategy 2022 to 2042.

At today's contract signing, Sonya Kavanagh, Chief Executive, Kildare County Council said; "We are delighted to reach this important milestone of the M4/ N4 westbound bus priority measures project. We look forward to continuing to work closely with South Dublin County Council and the team at Arup to deliver a new bus priority route project which will result in better services by reducing traffic congestion, enabling more reliable and efficient journey times, and connecting key destinations."

Michael McAdam, A/Senior Engineer, South Dublin County Council said; "South Dublin County Council welcomes the appointment of Arup as technical advisors for the M4N4 Westbound Bus Priority Measures scheme.

South Dublin County Council looks forward to working closely with Arup, Kildare County Council, the NTA and TII to advance this important project."




