

# Local representatives welcome review of Lucan buses but say more is needed

People Before Profit TD for Dublin Midwest Gino Kenny and Councillor Madeleine Johansson have welcomed a review of the C1 and C2 bus services in Lucan.



he representatives made the comments following a meeting with the NTA to discuss a number of issues with bus services in the Lucan area. They were informed that the NTA are currently waiting for a proposal from Dublin Bus regarding the C1 and C2 routes. Both representatives reported having been contacted by residents about issues with capacity on the C1 and C2, particularly at peak times.

Gino Kenny commented: "I welcome the review of the C1 and C2 routes. It's clear to me that we need more buses on these routes, particularly at peak times and in the early mornings. We have also asked the NTA to look at providing additional services on the P29 route in the morning time. There is a growing population in the wider Lucan area and people want to use public transport instead of private cars, but this is very difficult when you can't get on a bus or when buses don't show up.

"We also raised the need for an additional train in

the morning from Adamstown to Dublin City Centre, but we were informed that not enough funding had been allocated to provide this. I will be contacting the Minister for Transport about this to request additional funding for an extra train."

Cllr Madeleine Johansson added: "People are contacting us all the time because of problems with the buses. The buses from Lucan to the city centre are full to capacity, particularly at peak times and on Saturdays.

"The problem of 'ghost buses' has also been reported numerous times, which is when buses that are scheduled don't show up at all. Sometimes people have been left waiting an hour for the next bus. We raised this with the NTA, and they said that they are aware of this still happening but hoping that the situation will improve with increased recruitment of drivers.

"I welcome that the C1 and C2 routes are being reviewed and I hope that they will be able to put on extra buses as soon as possible."



# Most of us are still putting waste into wrong bin, says EPA

The majority of households and businesses in Ireland are putting their waste into the wrong bin, according to the Environmental Protection Agency.



t has called on local authorities to enforce the roll-out of the three-bin system - compost, recycling, general waste - and educate people on the importance of segregating waste.

David Pollard, Programme Manager of the EPA's Office of Environmental Enforcement has said two thirds of the waste that goes into the general waste bin should not go into it, but should be put into the recycling or organic bins.

He said around two million tonnes of municipal waste is produced every year and two thirds of that "doesn't need to be there".

"The critical issue with waste is the segregation of our waste because if we don't segregate our waste, we fail to recycle. If we don't recycle, more of our waste goes into landfill and incinerators. So, it's absolutely critical that people segregate their waste," he said.

Mr Pollard said the role of local authorities in protecting the environment is "absolutely crucial".

These are the people on the ground, who are closest to what is happening, he said.

These cover waste, water, air and noise pollution, and governance processes.

The EPA said that while combatting illegal waste activities was carried out well by local authorities, household and commercial waste management was the poorest performing area overall.

The EPA wants a greater focus from local authorities on the roll-out of brown bins for organic waste, farm inspections to protect water quality, and a greater clampdown on the sale of smoky fuels.

How can we help? It is difficult to know sometimes which bin to use. Hopefully the REPAK poster published with this article giving a list of what can be recycled will be helpful.

# VISION IRELAND, THE NEW NAME FOR NCBI, USHERS IN A CHANGE IN SIGHT AFTER A CENTURY OF SERVICE PROVISION

At an event at 58 South William Street, Dublin 2, which was the organisation's first official office in the 1930s, NCBI, the national sight loss agency, changes its name to Vision Ireland, as the true size of the community of people who are blind or vision impaired is revealed.



he name change is designed to be more inclusive, ensuring that everyone knows Vision Ireland supports people with a wide range of visual impairments.

According to census data, published recently, there are more than 296,000 people in Ireland who are blind or have a vision impairment. The name change for the 92-year-old national sight loss agency is designed to reach even more of the 6% of the population, or one in 17 people who are blind or have a vision impairment. The data show that blindness or vision impairment affects 27% of all people experiencing at least one long-lasting condition or difficulty to any extent.

At a special ceremony in Dublin to mark the launch, Chris White, Vision Ireland CEO, said: "Many people with sight issues are missing the opportunity to avail of our services because they are unaware that we support people with different levels of visual impairment. Our new name, Vision

Ireland, is designed to reflect our broad range of support.

"The Vision Ireland name was developed through extensive consultation with staff, service users and volunteers – and they also like how our new name better represents the forward-looking and dynamic organisation that we are.

"Our mission hasn't changed – we will continue as before – and continue to promote good eye health and continue to champion an inclusive society where physical and digital spaces are more accessible for all, regardless of abilities."

Speaking at the launch today, Paul Kelly, Chair of Vision Ireland, said: "As someone with a with a vision impairment that did not access the great services of the NCBI as my that did not access the great services of the NCBI as my family, my doctors and myself all thought it was not for me as I was not fully blind, I am particularly proud to be associated with the great staff and volunteers of Vision

Ireland today as we embark on the next phase of the journey to empower even more blind and visually impaired people in Ireland."

Messages of support for Vision Ireland poured in from all over the world from RNIB (Royal National Institute for the Blind) in the UK, Vision Australia, European Blind Union and the World Blind Union among others.

Commenting on the launch of Vision Ireland, Taoiseach, Leo Varadkar, outlined how the Government is committed to providing services for people with disabilities so that they can lead independent lives, while acknowledging there is much work to be done.

"With new thinking, new perspectives and pooling ideas, we will do better. And I'm glad that we can call on Vision Ireland's expertise in developing a barrier free and inclusive society. With the goal of enabling people to live an independent life of their choice, Vision Ireland is making a real difference to the lives of people every day. The dedication of Vision Ireland staff and volunteers is truly commendable," Mr Varadkar said.

Speaking in support of the launch, Robbie Henshaw, Member of the Board of Trustees of Vision Ireland, said: "I've been involved with NCBI for a number of years, and it has been both an honour and a privilege to witness the tremendous impact that it has on people who are blind or have a vision impairment. Their unwavering

commitment to providing essential support and resources has been a beacon of hope for so many people in Ireland. Their dedication to improving the lives of all those they support is truly remarkable, and I am proud to be a part of the next chapter for Vision Ireland."

Neasa Hourigan, TD, speaking at the launch event said: "Being the parent of a child who has a vision impairment, I have firsthand experience of the challenges and uncertainties that can arise. At every stage, NCBI has been a tremendous help, offering invaluable support and resources that have made a significant difference in our lives.

"The dedication and expertise has given us hope, empowerment, and a brighter future. We are immensely grateful for their unwavering assistance and I would encourage every parent and guardian to avail of Vision Ireland's support and services," Ms Hourigan added.

Also speaking at the event was Wicklow native Lar Keogh, who was born the same year NCBI was launched, 92 years ago. "I've had vision issues for quite a few years, but I didn't realise I could avail of the services of NCBI. It's been a revelation for me since I became a service user and I have been welcomed with open arms by everyone at Vision Ireland. Their support has been fantastic, and it's really made a big difference in my daily life."

The Excellence in Local Government Awards were held in conjunction with the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

#### **Winning Projects:**

Category: Festival of the Year

Project: Brigid 1500 – St Brigid's Festival 2023

Brigid 1500 is a 2-year programme to celebrate and commemorate St. Brigid; a woman, a life and a legacy. The aim of Brigid 1500 is to create a meaningful cultural and societal legacy that appeals to a diverse contemporary audience. Brigid 1500 engages communities with the

story and heritage of St. Brigid, providing a tangible connection with the past through events and programmes. The programme engages with the values St. Brigid championed, including faith and spirituality, biodiversity and sustainability, arts and culture, social justice, peace, hospitality and education. A 10-day festival took place to celebrate the inaugural St. Brigid's Bank Holiday, from 28th January to 7th February 2023. This programme was delivered in partnership with a dedicated Brigid 1500 Steering Committee. The celebrations included a school programme and 4 large flagship events alongside various community events delivered via a grant scheme and in collaboration with partner agencies.

Category: Municipal District Initiative Project: Wellbeing Roadshow

The Wellbeing roadshow by Kildare County Council was a targeted county-wide event hosted in the Kildare/

Newbridge MD. The roadshow took place in the Kilcullen Mart on Tuesday Feb 7th. They partnered with Kildare West Wicklow IFA to bring a community roadshow targeting isolated Farmers in to bring a community roadshow targeting isolated Farmers in Kildare. They made a deliberate decision to hold the event in a local mart to reduce barriers to participation and to ensure a sense of belonging on the day.

They had over 25 information stands from various agencies and services including farmer related services and supports. They had information on:

- · Safety and security

They also introduced new Fitsticks for Farmers programme and had Minister Heydon in attendance and Ceann Comhairle speak on his journey with prostate cancer.







#### **UPCOMING PROJECTS & PROVIDING NEWS UPDATES**



#### Lucan Village Works

Approved enhancement works for Lucan Village include upgrades to the Village Green, the Weir Promenade and entrance to Lucan Desmesne have a revised starting date for late November and are expected to take 12 months to complete.

#### Airlie Park

Whilst a very welcome and much needed facility, the planned opening in the Summer incurred some seeding and drainage issues – end October opening anticipated. Meanwhile, I continue to press upon the Council for local club priority.

#### Lucan Pool

Further delays mean the pool has a revised completion date of December in the best-case scenario now. I have relayed the sheer frustration being felt by the local community to Council management, whilst calling for greater accountability on public project works.

#### Cycle Loop Urban Greenway

Phase 1 of the Grand Canal to Lucan Urban Greenway has been progressing – Phase 1A to the N4 is expected to go into construction in early 2024.

#### Lucan House

Official confirmation regarding the purchase is eagerly awaited and expected to be announced soon. Potential uses are boundless with lots of local excitement.

#### Old Lucan Schoolhouse

Although 'head of terms' are agreed toward the purchase of the Old Schoolhouse (opposite Courtney's) in the Village, unexpected delays outside of the control of the Council have resulted in a delay in the timeline for the transaction.

#### Esker Embankment

Whilst supportive of the Esker Ridge 'proposed' permeability project, this must address all resident concerns through direct consultation. I have echoed this sentiment to Council officials, whilst keeping residents in Moy Glas, Castle Riada and the surrounds up to date with several news leaflet drops over the past 2 years.

#### Lucan Bridge

The latest response I received (5th Oct) for a commitment toward restoration works, including the removal of vegetation from the bridge stated that a procurement to secure a specialist contractor is underway – sometime in 2024 hopefully!



# Community Incensed at Vandalism of Newly Opened Lucan Parks


"The new park was due to open in early summer; however, this was delayed due to some initial seeding problems, followed by some drainage issues. 
#### Cllr Ó Brádaigh said.

"Increasingly, we are witnessing some of our parks being overtaken by a minority bent on destruction and anti-social behaviour. Graffiti 'tagging' is also becoming a huge issue throughout our neighbourhoods, costing our local authority important financial resources needed elsewhere. Some of our parks are being used after dark for drug abuse, illegal fires, and general nuisance behaviour. We cannot allow a situation whereby our park facilities are overrun by certain individuals that have nothing to offer the community, and somehow feel their assaults on our communities will go unpunished.

"Following this recent spate of graffiti daubing within both Airlie Park and on seating and benches in Tandy's Lane Park, I have raised this matter with An Garda Siochana and have written to Lucan Garda Station. They have passed this onto their community policing section and are committed to increasing Garda visibility in the vicinity now. As a member of the Joint Policing Committee, I will also be raising the matter. This type of senseless activity needs to be confronted and we must stand together in support of our communities and each other!"



- chopped cooked bacon, chilli flakes or chopped roasted hazelnuts, to serve (optional)


#### Method
