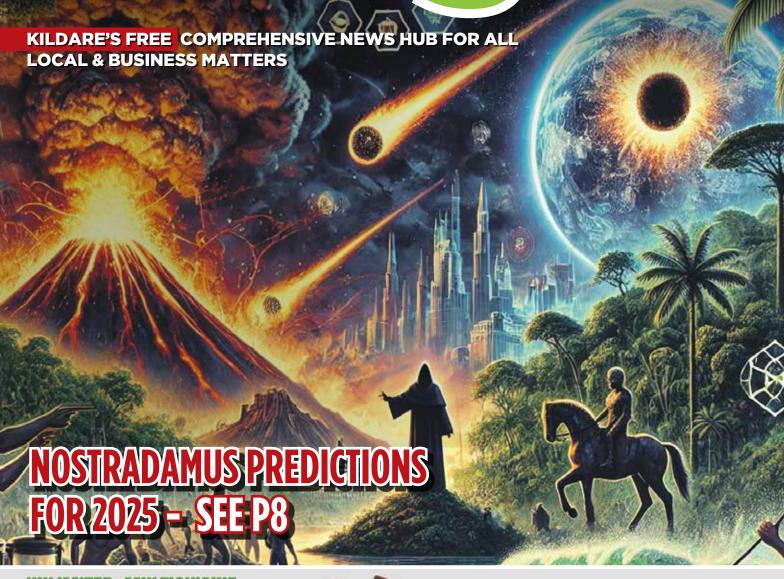

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# ADHD or Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder

ADHD is becoming more prevalent in Ireland today. What is it and why?

#### What is ADHD?

ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder) is a neurodevelopmental condition characterized by persistent patterns of inattention, hyperactivity, and impulsivity that interfere with daily functioning. It affects people of all ages, though symptoms may vary between children and adults.

#### Key symptoms include:

- Inattention: Difficulty focusing, organizing, or completing
- Hyperactivity: Restlessness, an inability to stay still, or excessive movement.
- Impulsivity: Acting without thinking, interrupting others, or struggling with self-control.

ADHD can range in severity and is thought to arise from a combination of genetic, neurological, and environmental factors. It is not caused by parenting or lifestyle choices, although these can influence symptom management.

Why is ADHD becoming more prevalent in Ireland?
The increased prevalence of ADHD diagnoses in Ireland can be attributed to several factors:

#### 1. Improved Awareness and Education:

Public and professional understanding of ADHD has significantly improved. Teachers, parents, and healthcare professionals are more likely to recognize symptoms and seek assessments.

Campaigns by advocacy groups such as ADHD Ireland have highlighted ADHD's impacts and the importance of early diagnosis and intervention.

#### 2.Better Diagnostic Tools and Access:

Advances in diagnostic criteria and tools have led to more accurate identifications of ADHD, particularly in adults who were previously overlooked

#### 3.Increased Focus on Mental Health:

Growing attention to mental health has encouraged people to seek help for challenges they may have ignored in the past. This shift includes greater scrutiny of behaviours in children and adults that might be linked to ADHD

#### 4. Changing Social and Educational Expectations:

Modern life places higher demands on attention, organization, and multitasking. In settings like schools or workplaces, individuals with undiagnosed ADHD may struggle, prompting evaluations and diagnoses.

#### 5. Reduction in Stigma:

ADHD is increasingly recognized as a legitimate medical condition rather than a behavioural issue, encouraging more individuals to seek diagnosis and treatment.

**Broader Considerations:** 

While diagnosis rates are increasing, ADHD itself may not be more common. Instead, greater recognition and reduced stigma likely mean individuals who would have gone undiagnosed in the past are now receiving the help they need.

For Ireland specifically, ADHD support services remain under strain despite rising diagnoses, highlighting a need for more resources to address this growing awareness.

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## Kildare Civil Defence takes 3rd place at the World Rescue Challenge, Azores, Portugal

Ranked as the world's fourth best Trauma Team

ildare County Council is delighted to announce that Shannon Reid, Assistant Civil Defence Officer, Kildare Civil Defence, and Aaron Cullen, Volunteer, Kildare Civil Defence, achieved 3rd place in the Trauma Complex Challenge at the recent World Rescue Challenge, Azores, Portugal, and were ranked as the 4th best Trauma Team globally.

Competing against 31 other trauma teams worldwide, the team is representing Kildare Civil Defence and Ireland for the second time at The World Championships, and their second time to receive a 3rd place prize.

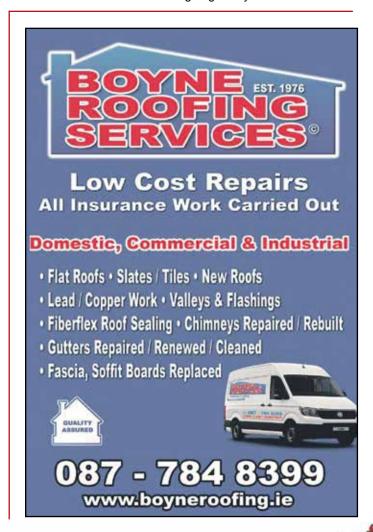
The team were assessed on their pre-hospital emergency care and "lifesaving" capabilities, for two fifteen-minute trauma-based scenarios that evaluated scene safety, initial patient contact, assessment of injuries and condition, treatment of casualty and patient handover. The results highlight the high standard of training and professionalism of Civil Defence Volunteers throughout Ireland.

The objective of the World Rescue Organisation Trauma Challenge is to assist in the development of trauma related skills of Firefighters, First Responders and Rescue Workers and to enable them to deal successfully with the vast range of casualty-centred incidents. The mission is to provide a platform for rescue personnel from around the world to come together, to enhance and develop competence levels in first responder trauma care.

Having secured first place in the Rescue Organisation of Ireland National Trauma competition for two consecutive years, Kildare Civil Defence achieved National titles as the Best Trauma Medics, earning them the opportunity to represent Ireland in the World Rescue Challenge. They hold the highest ranking as an

Irish Trauma Team on the global stage.

The Kildare team has achieved a significant accomplishment by showcasing excellent technical skill and care, alongside other Irish Teams who are acknowledged globally.





#### Kildare County Council wins at Excellence in **Local Government Awards 2024**

Winner of Age Friendly Initiative Award

ildare County Council was the recipient of the Age Friendly Initiative award at the 2024 Excellence in Local Government Awards, which took place in the Crown Plaza Hotel, Dublin on Thursday 21st November.

Following the census of 2016, Ballymore-Eustace was selected as a potential village for Age Friendly and Climate Change Friendly initiatives by Kildare County Council due to its high proportion of elderly residents compared to the rest of the county. Ballymore-Eustace was selected as a case study for how rural commuter villages can implement community-level solutions to address climate change, focusing on Climate Action.

The objective for Ballymore-Eustace was to identify the problems affecting the walkability of the village for elderly residents and at-risk road users. Through analysing the problems and talking about possible solutions, Ballymore-Eustace had the opportunity to enhance its walkability and transform into a more accessible public area, while finding sustainable ways to increase resilience in the face of climate change by involving the community.

Instead of solely concentrating on main street in Ballymore Eustace, Kildare County Council also considered other amenities in the village, such as the river walk. Kildare County Council upgraded a section of the standard trail by adding new surfaces and constructing fishing areas, turning 800m into an accessible recreation spot. This pathway is now open to everyone and can be accessed by all.

This project has enhanced and promoted the inclusivity of, and engagement in, community life for older persons and individuals with disabilities, while enhancing the availability of public and community spaces.

The Excellence in Local Government Awards showcase best

practice in local government and recognise the skills, hard work, innovation and enthusiasm within local government that can often go unrecognised. The Excellence in Local Government Awards were held in conjunction with the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage.

1. Natural Disasters: Nostradamus mentions volcanic eruptions and flooding, which some a continuation of geopolitical tensions and

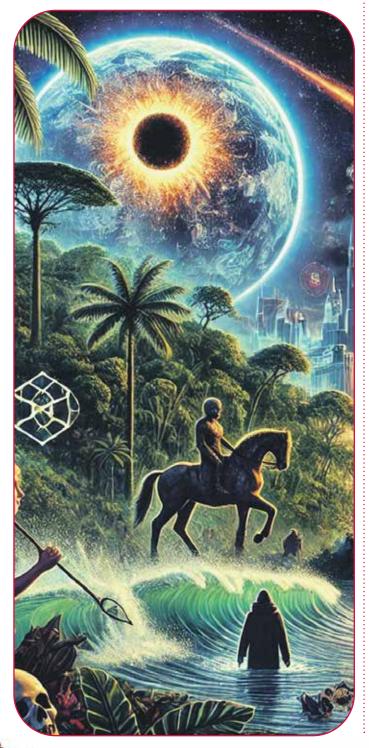
interpret as potential disasters in Brazil, particularly around the Amazon region and its capital, Brasília. These could signify flooding or increased volcanic activity in South America

Despite the ominous tone, current projections suggest it poses no significant threat



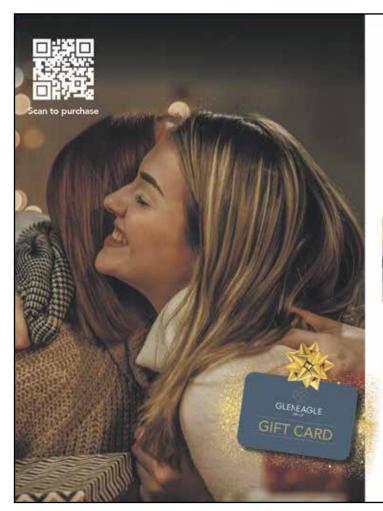


#### 4. The "Aquatic Empire":

Nostradamus allegedly foresees severe flooding displacing millions, possibly linked to rising sea levels from climate change. The emergence of a "mysterious leader" from the sea, forming an "Aquatic Empire," symbolizes power shifts or challenges related to this crisis

5. Medical and Economic Shifts: Some interpretations point to significant breakthroughs in medicine, potentially related to advances like gene therapy, and economic upheavals involving new forms of currency or shifts in global wealth

These predictions are speculative and open to interpretation. While they align with modern concerns like climate change, geopolitical instability, and scientific advancements, they are not grounded in specific evidence. Nostradamus' writings are often interpreted differently over time. Let us see what 2025 produces.

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# Kildare County Council announce Final Phase for Submissions for Community



Final opportunity for community groups and organisations to benefit from this significant funding initiative

ildare County Council is pleased to announce the final application window for the Community Recognition Fund 2024 is now open, offering a final chance for community groups and organisations to benefit from this significant funding program.

In March 2024, Kildare County Council launched details of the 2024 Community Recognition Fund, a government-led program aimed at supporting local communities in recognition of their contribution in welcoming and hosting significant numbers of arrivals from Ukraine and other countries.

As part of this initiative, Kildare was allocated €830,007 to finance a range of community projects throughout the county. To date, a number of deserving projects in Kildare have successfully secured funding through this scheme.

We are now seeking expressions of interest for the final phase of applications. This is a unique opportunity for communities across the county to gain financial support for initiatives that are capital in nature, will benefit local areas and enhance community facilities.

Community groups, organisations, and relevant stakeholders are encouraged to submit their applications during this final window to ensure consideration for funding. Funding for or improvements to existing



sports clubs, play facilities, recreational areas, walking amenities, local transport and additional initiatives are eligible for funding under the Community Recognition Fund.

Criteria for eligibility includes:

- A minimum spend of 50% of funding from the Community Recognition Fund must be incurred for the project by October 2025.
- · All projects must be fully completed with funding drawn down by October 2026. The minimum level of funding for an individual project is €50,000 to a maximum of €500,000.
- Areas in the County with the highest number of arrivals from Ukraine and other countries will be deemed eligible.

The expression of interest process will be competitive and applications from areas that have the highest number of arrivals from Ukraine and other countries will be deemed eligible. The closing date for applications for expressions of interest is 4:00 p.m. Friday, 13th December 2024.









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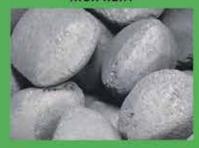


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# Kildare man rowing 5,000 kilometres across the Atlantic in memory of his daughter

John O'Driscoll is doing it for his daughter Saoirse (13), who passed away in April from congenital heart disease

heartbroken father is taking on the challenge of a lifetime by rowing 5,000 kilometres across the Atlantic in memory of his daughter. John O'Driscoll is doing it for his daughter Saoirse (13), who passed away in April from congenital heart disease. Her death came just days after being accepted onto the emergency transplant list at London's Great Ormond Street Hospital.

John (45) – along with four friends – formed Team Power of One and are taking part in the World's Toughest Row to raise funds for Crumlin Children's Hospital and Heart Children Ireland. John, from Lucan, said the idea was first formed two years ago when Saoirse was still alive.

Now he is taking the epic journey in her memory and to raise €250,000 for the two charities. The tough challenge starts on December 12 in the Canary Island and finishes in Antigua after approximately 39 days of continuous rowing. John said part of the reason why he decided to take on the

row was to mirror Saoirse's daily struggles.

He said: "Every day I felt like Saoirse's journey in life was like rowing the Atlantic. She would wake up every morning and what happened that day was never in her control, it depended on how her body felt, how her heart was feeling.

"I wanted to inspire her like she has inspired me. She didn't get to see it happen, but she was hugely excited about me doing it. We have raised €125,000 but we are going to dig deep now to hit the €250,000."

John continued: "Saoirse was amazing. I learned more from her than I could ever have taught her.

"She was our superhero because she was so strong, so determined and never gave up. She always got on with life no matter what it threw at her. She was incredible."

John said his wife Aoife convinced him it would have been what Saoirse wanted. He added: "It's not long since we lost her. Myself and Aoife talked a few weeks ago about it and she said to me, 'You started this journey with Saoirse, you should finish it for her'.

"There will be 37 other boats and it's the fastest boat across the Atlantic to land in Antigua. It will probably take about 39 days in total.

"That's the Irish record, 39 days, and we would like to make Saoirse and the charities proud by smashing that." His friends Roger McMarrow (48), Conor McCarthy (52), Enda McNicholas (52) and Daragh Kelly (55) are going with him.

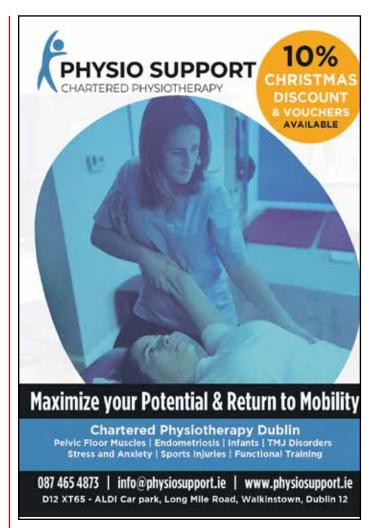
He said: "There will be five of us in the boat, which is eight and a half metres long by one and a half metres wide. There will be three of us rowing at any one time.

"We do two hours rowing, two hours resting, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We will have rowed 700 hours each by the end of it."

During Saoirse's lifetime, she underwent 30 surgeries including open-heart surgery at just six-months-old. She became a passionate advocate and fundraiser for charities that support children with CHD. She competed in the Dublin Marathon where her father John pushed her wheelchair for the entire race.

John said one of the big down sides to the challenge is being away from his wife and son Riain (10) during Christmas. He continued: "It will be Aoife and Riain's first one without Saoirse and I. It will be very tough.

People's lives move on, but we are stuck on April 16, the day Saoirse died. John concluded: "Her picture is on the side of the boat which means she will be there with me the whole way."

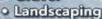


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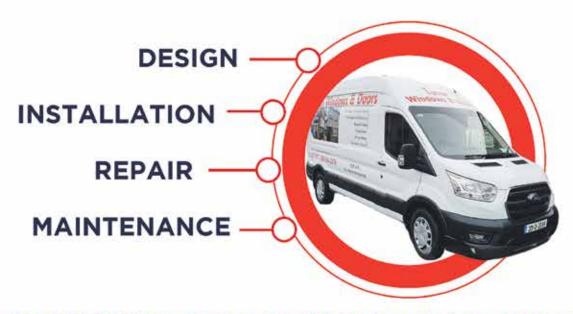
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#### **ELECTRIC VEHICLE SALES**

Are Electric Vehicle sales slowing in Ireland?

(EVs) in Ireland have slowed down in 2024 compared to the previous record-breaking years. Several: factors contribute to this decline:

- 1. Grant Reductions: The reduction of government grants for EV purchases from €5,000 to €3,500 in mid-2023 has discouraged buyers. Many rushed to buy before the change, leading to a dip in demand afterward
- 2. Supply Chain Issues: Delays in shipping vehicles from Asia, including a shortage of car transport ships, have hindered the supply of popular EV brands like Hyundai and Kia. This has led to fewer EVs being available for purchase.
- 3. Market Adjustments: Price reductions on new EVs have impacted the resale value of older models, causing some hesitation among potential buyers. Additionally, buyers are waiting for updated EV models, such as Tesla's Model Y facelift, rather than purchasing current versions.
- 4. Infrastructure Challenges: While public charging infrastructure is improving, it remains inadequate in some areas, deterring buyers, those without home charging especially facilities.

Despite these challenges, the EV market in

es, the sales of electric vehicles Ireland remains a key focus for policymakers and manufacturers. Future improvements in infrastructure and technological advancements are expected to sustain long-term growth in EV adoption.

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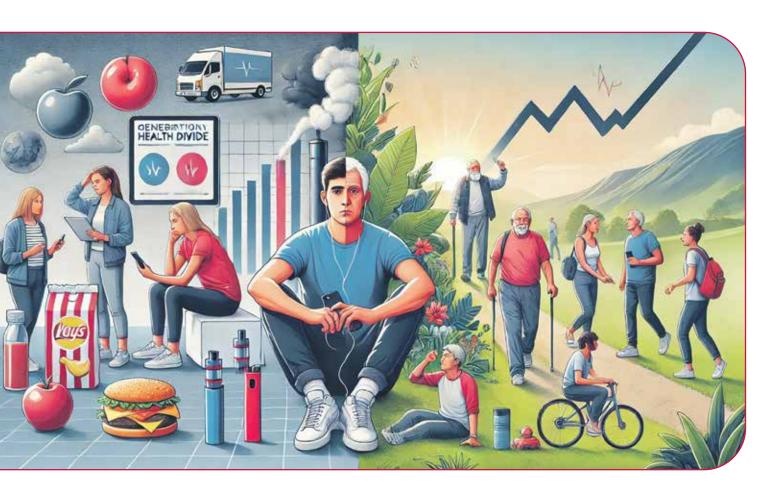
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# Generational divide emerges in Ireland's health and wellbeing standards



Generational divide emerges in Ireland's health and wellbeing standards – with more than half of younger adults considered in 'poor health'

- The National Health Score\* continues to decline for fifth consecutive year – reveals the Irish Life 2024 Health of the Nation annual research report
- 100,000 more adults in Ireland have fallen into the "poor health" category, with 60% of adults now overweight or obese
- More than twice as many under 35-year-olds in the "poor health" category, compared to older adults
- Increased numbers of younger adults now

smoking or vaping – more than 1 in 3 (36%)

 Research confirms optimism for future (89%), indicating opportunity to start making meaningful changes for better health

November 19th, 2024: A generational gap is emerging in Ireland's health and wellbeing standards as people aged 16-34 score worse across a range of physical and mental wellbeing metrics, in comparison to older generations. The



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research looks at Ireland's overall health and wellbeing standards across a range of metrics, pinpointing the current health challenges Irish adults face, and highlighting the opportunities to make positive changes for our overall wellbeing. The findings were published today as part of the Irish Life 2024 Health of the Nation research.

Ireland's National Health Score declined for the fifth consecutive year, with a score of 520 in 2024, a decrease from 523 last year. The National Health Score has now declined by 4.7% since 2019, highlighting the need to incorporate healthier lifestyle habits to improve our overall health status.

100,000 more people in Ireland are now considered to be in 'poor health', with over half (54%) of all 16–34-year-olds now within this category, compared to 26% of all adults\*\*. A larger proportion of young people – over 1 in 3 (36%) - are now vaping or smoking indicating habits form in teenage years, reaffirming the need for greater supports and education in this age cohort. Overall, 27% of adults said they vape or smoke, compared to 23% in 2023 and 18% in 2022.

The research shows an increase in average weight with 6 in 10 (60%) of adults in Ireland now considered overweight or obese. Ireland's average weight has increased from 79kg in 2023 to 81kg this year. On average, 37% of Ireland's adult population are now spending more than half their day in a sedentary position, as our national average Body Mass Index (BMI) increases to 27.1, which is categorised as overweight.

#### Other key findings include:

- 1 in 4 adults (25%) report feeling stressed, depressed or anxious more than half the time.
- Average consumption of fruit and vegetable stands at 4.6 portions per day amongst all adults.
- Almost two-thirds of workplace managers (63%) see mental health needs of employees growing year on year. 42% believe their workplace is supportive of employee mental health.

Despite the health challenges that are present, 89% of Irish adults report feeling positive about the future, with 90% of all respondents believing in their ability to overcome challenges.

Dr Carol Rogan, Psychologist, Irish Life Wellbeing, said: "The results of this year's Irish Life Health of the Nation report paints a bleak picture of the nation's health, showcasing the downward trajectory we have been experiencing since 2018. The mental wellbeing findings are of significant concern and mirror the most recent global findings which also show no sign of a post-pandemic bounce back. It's evident that we all have a part to play – government, state bodies, employers and individuals - to take action to start to reverse the trends we have seen in recent years.

The findings of this year's research also bring into stark focus the mental wellbeing of younger adults – highlighting a clear generation gap, with younger generations struggling more overall. The good news is that the report shows that managers in the workplace are increasingly aware of the mental health needs of their employees, with almost three-quarters of managers in support of formal training in this area, with many external

supports available to assist managers improve confidence and support for employees across all age cohorts. In terms of outlook, we do see that people still think they can change, with 9 in 10 people feeling positive about the future and confident in their resilience to overcome issues. As a nation we need to take the necessary actions now, to improve our mental wellbeing by making positive health and lifestyle choices."

#### Details of the report and potential actions: Physical Health

Good physical health is a cornerstone of people's wellbeing and is dependent on a range of factors including BMI, nutrition, physical activity and lifestyle. This year's findings indicate a rise in BMI, smoking, vaping and sedentary behaviour. Irish Life's health experts encourage people to break up prolonged sedentary periods and replace them with physical activity (of any intensity). On the positive side, there is evidence to suggest awareness of the importance of good nutrition is increasing.

**Mental Health** 

The overall results in mental health are broadly comparable to last year, although the continued decline in mental wellbeing among 16-34s is of concern. In 2024, this cohort was more likely to report feeling stressed, anxious, sad or depressed than it was in 2023. This appears to be a global trend.

The research indicates managers see an increase in the numbers coming to them with mental health difficulties, and often feel ill-equipped to respond effectively. Businesses and organisations must continue to grow their mental health supports and put them front and centre of their wellbeing strategies.

#### **Social Connection**

Social health is defined by how people experience their lives in terms of their sense

of belonging, relationships, patterns in socialising and being integrated into society. Good social health is a strong indicator of a healthier lifestyle in adults of all ages. Irish Life's findings show that social health has not significantly recovered since its rapid decline in 2020.



# Where are the Policies for Older People in General Election 2024?

Reacting to the first weeks of the 2024 general election campaign, Age Action is asking all political parties and candidates to make clear what they will do to meet the needs and concerns of older people, to uphold the rights and equality of all of us as we age, and to combat ageism.

r Nat O'Connor, senior policy adviser, said:
"In this general election, nearly one in three voters will be aged 60 or older, yet older people are telling Age Action that they haven't heard meaningful discussion of policies addressing their concerns."

Older people have told us that 'we do not think the politicians take sufficient notice of older people' and that 'we're not respected'.

Older people have told Age Action about the difficulty of making ends meet on the state pension, their frustration of trying to access public services, banking or utilities without constantly being forced to go online, as well as growing anxieties around housing, healthcare, and transport.

"Today, there are over one million people aged 60 or older, including 185,000 aged 80 or older. In just twenty years from now, there will be nearly twice as many older people, including many more in advanced older age who will need the state to provide health and social care services, as well as adequate housing and transport systems. None of the parties seem to be planning long-term to meet this eventuality, which is a major concern for older voters, and should be for all of us as we age."

"Age Action is calling on all parties to take a new approach to ageing policy, based on the rights of older people and reflecting their diversity and diverse needs. Political parties need to demonstrate that they take older people seriously and that they are capable of meeting the changing needs of our ageing population." Dr O'Connor concluded.

Age Action's ten asks for the general election are:

- 1. Appoint a Commissioner for Ageing and Older Persons, with a supporting legal framework and an independent budget, to ensure we are all treated fairly and with dignity as we age.
  - 2. Pass a law to benchmark and index the state pension : people.

- so that its rate will always be at least equal to 34% of total average earnings to preserve its status as the bedrock of income in older age.
- 3. Abolish the prevalent ageist practice of mandatory retirement, so that we all have the option to remain in or re-enter employment beyond age 65, as a step towards eliminating legally permitted age discrimination.
- 4. Develop a comprehensive, all-of-government national ageing strategy, with a requirement for implementation plans in every relevant state agency, to eradicate ageism and to ensure that we prepare sufficiently for the demographic transition.
- 5. Deliver on the pledge of a strong, fully universal and accessible healthcare system that is tax-funded and free-of-charge at the point of use.
- 6. Implement an Energy Guarantee for Older Persons payment, targeting those in poorly insulated homes as well as those on lower incomes, as a tangible example of climate justice.
- 7. Prohibit 'digital only' services, fund digital skills training and adequately resource traditional alternatives such as desk and telephone services, as a step towards implementing a rights-based approach to accessing publicly funded services.
- 8. Introduce a care strategy using a human rightsbased approach to improve, expand, and harmonize our care options.
- 9. Implement policies to ensure that all of us can age in place in our homes and communities, in particular, support and protections for older persons renting, and the enforcement of universal design principles for all new builds.
- 10. Support the introduction of a UN Convention on the Rights of Older Persons to address the gaps in the existing human rights system by clarifying states' human rights obligations and responsibilities towards older people.

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
